As a result of citizen input regarding the number of portable bathroom units for Recreation Department activities at the Middle School and the Senior High School, the County Administrator presented information on the cost involved to add additional units at each of the schools.

IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING — P-90-4 — IDA

This being the time and place as advertised in the Progress-Index Newspaper on Monday, March 26 and April 2, 1990, for the Board of Supervisors to conduct a Public Hearing to consider a rezoning request by the Industrial Development Authority (IDA) of Dinwiddie County, to rezone the following from Agricultural, General, District A-2 to Industrial, Limited, District M-1: a 178 acres consisting of land parcels 20-3A, 20-45A, 20-3C, 20-3B, part of 20-3, 20-44A, 20-44I, 20-44C and 20-44J, located on Route 460W in the Namozine Magisterial District.

Mr. Leonard K. Ponder, Director of Planning, presented the Application, stating the IDA requested this rezoning for the location of a prospective industry. He stated the industry will be screened, buffered, and highway improvements will be made to protect adjacent property owners. At their February 14 and April 11, 1990 Planning Commission meetings, the Planning Commission recommended approval since this prospective business will increase employment possibilities, bring additional revenue, and will attract other industries to the County.

No one spoke in favor of or against the rezoning.

Upon motion of Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Clay, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that rezoning application P-90-4 be tabled at this time.
