IN RE: MINUTES

Upon motion of Mr. Tickle, seconded by Mr. Moody, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the minutes of the November 20, 1991 Regular Meeting, and the November 20, 1991 Continuation Meeting, are hereby approved in their entirety.

IN RE: CLAIMS

Upon motion of Mr. Moody, seconded by Mr. Clay, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the following claims are approved and funds appropriated for same using checks #16402 thru #16677, (void checks #16334 - 16401): General Fund - \$250,947.86; E911 - \$2,156.84; Self Insurance - \$46,311.03; Capital Projects - \$56,747.29; Law Library - \$14.30 for a total of \$356,177.34.

IN RE: FIRE PROGRAMS FUND

The Assistant County Administrator told the Board that in the past the Fire Funds received from the State have been placed in the general fund, which has caused the accounting for these funds to be quite cumbersome. Therefore, she asked for authorization to establish a fire programs fund and to transfer a present balance of \$20,000 into that fund.

Upon motion of Mr. Moody, seconded by Mr. Bracey, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye", the Treasurer was authorized to establish a Fire Programs Fund and to transfer into that fund \$20,000 from the general fund.

IN RE: CITIZEN COMMENTS

1. Mr. Freeman Browning told the Board that he had found on page 91 in the "Carrefour of the Commonwealth", more historical facts dated 1781 regarding the historical name of Halifax Road. He said he considered the name change a political issue and that the Board needed to go ahead and act on it. He asked them to reconsider the name change because the moratorium is up December 12.

Mr. Tickle said the Board has not addressed how the County is going to handle road name changes and it needed to give administration direction.

Mr. Clay stated that he personally was hesitant to open up the issue again now that all the addresses, checks, and other things have been changed -- he said the Board would be opening a can of worms.

Mr. Moody said he would like to extend the moratorium to allow for the completion of the E911 requirements.

The Assistant County Administrator told the Board that the moratorium was originally set to take care of the E911 needs.

The County Administrator said he had the deepest respect for historical preservation and had learned that Dinwiddie county resident's concern for it ran long and deep also. But at the same time he doesn't

want to jeopardize implementation of E911. It is very important to get the 1% needed to reach the 95% mark.

Upon motion of Mr. Moody, seconded by Mr. Bracey, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia that the moratorium on street name changes is extended for 90-days to accommodate the E911 requirements.

2. Mr. Chuck Nobles, of Quaker Road, asked the Board if December 18 was when Contel Cellular was supposed to meet with the Board again? He also wanted to know if the people had been notified of the meeting?

Mr. Ponder stated that a letter would be sent to adjacent property owners on Route 620 and the people who had asked to be notified on the sign-up list.

IN RE: RESOLUTION -- AMERICAN LUNG ASSOCIATION -- CHRISTMAS SEAL MONTH

Ms. Maria MacLaughlin, Christmas Seal Ambassador for Dinwiddie and Petersburg, told the Board that her responsibility is to heighten awareness of the seriousness of lung related diseases. This year marks the 84th anniversary of the Christmas Seal. Lung disease is the third leading cause of death in this country. Ms. Mac Laughlin asked the Chairman to declare the month of December, 1991 Christmas Seal Month in recognition of the volunteers of the American Lung Association of Virginia for their work on behalf of the health and well being of our people.

Upon motion of Mr. Moody, seconded by Mr. Tickle, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye", the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, this year marks the 84th anniversary of the Christmas Seal, the symbolic emblem of the American Lung Association -- The Christmas Seal People -- which has aided generation of our people in the nation's first citizen-supported effort to fight lung disease; and

WHEREAS, the American Lung Association of Virginia, part of the oldest voluntary public health agency in the nation, was originally known as the Virginia Anti-Tuberculosis Association and led the fight against tuberculosis in Dinwiddie; and

WHEREAS, lung disease, including lung cancer, is the third leading cause of death in this country; and

WHEREAS, through contributions to the annual Christmas Seal Campaign, the American Lung Association of Virginia continues to fight all lung diseases through programs of education, community service, advocacy and research;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT I, Charles W. Harrison, Chairman of Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors, declare that the month of December, 1991 be hereby designated CHRISTMAS SEAL MONTH in recognition of the volunteers of the American Lung Association of Virginia for their work on behalf of the health and well being of our people.

IN RE: REPORT -- VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Ms. Penny Forrest, Resident Engineer, Virginia Department of Transportation, gave the Board an update on the following projects:

1. The work on Route 700 will not be completed until this spring.
2. Route 675 will be closed for 2-3 weeks because of a wash-out for repairs.

3. A workshop is needed with the Board to go over the six-year secondary construction program which will take approximately one-half hour; she said then they could possibly have the public hearing in February.

The Board agreed to meet on January 15, 1992 at 7:00 p.m. for the Workshop.

IN RE: COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE

Mrs. Deborah Marston, Commissioner of the Revenue, had nothing to report for the month but stated she would be glad to answer any questions.

IN RE: TREASURER -- REPORT

Mr. William E. Jones submitted his report for the month to the Board. He told the Board he had nothing else to report but would answer any questions.

IN RE: COMMONWEALTH ATTORNEY

Mr. T. O. Rainey, III, Commonwealth Attorney, was not present.

IN RE: SHERIFF

Mr. Claiborne Fisher, Deputy Sheriff, stated he had nothing to report but would answer any questions.

IN RE: BUILDING INSPECTOR -- REPORT

Mr. Dwayne Abernathy, Building Inspector, submitted his report for the month of November to the Board.

The County Administrator informed the Board that the Building Inspector had to acquire assistance this week from R. Stuart Royer's Engineering firm just for a minimum amount of time for the warehouse project on U.S. #1 north.

IN RE: ANIMAL WARDEN -- REPORT

Mr. John Mellick, Animal Warden, submitted his report for the month. He told the Board that Mr. Cecil P. Lipscomb's claim was included in their packet per their request. He said the problem he had with the claim was that through out the investigations there were seldom any remains found. Also, the area for the fowl was not in a confinement area.

After much discussion the Board decided to pay one-half of Mr. Lipscomb's claim, due to facts that made the case hard to determine if it was dogs or wild animals attacking the fowl.

Upon motion of Mr. Moody, seconded by Mr. Clay, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye", the Board authorized payment of \$193.50, half of \$387.00, to Mr. Lipscomb for 112 chickens, 1 turkey, and 20 guineas.

IN RE: DIRECTOR OF PLANNING

Mr. Leonard Ponder, Director of Planning, told the Board that he would like to have an appointment by each member for an Evaluation Committee to review RFP's for engineering for the West Petersburg Planning Grant by next Wednesday.

IN RE: E911 UPDATE

Mr. John Clarke, Planning Technician, told the Board that 120 more addresses were needed to reach the 95% completion mark. He said that he felt sure that figure had already been reached. Mr. Clarke said that he had called about 70 people on the list who had already sent their change of address to C&P and had not been listed as reported. About 38-40 on the list live outside the County and an additional 175 of the 615 which are listed are C&P numbers (service buildings, equipment checks, etc.). Mr. Clarke said he has a meeting with C&P on Tuesday to discuss these problems.

The Board asked Mr. Clarke to have a representative from C&P at the next meeting so that they could discuss these problems.

IN RE: DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL SERVICES -- REPORT

Mrs. Peggy McElveen, Director of Social Services, stated she was going to have a shortfall in her 1991-92 budget. She has completed the mid-year budget review and also had heard from the State unofficially that it is reimbursing at 50-50 rather than a 80-20 split. If this is true, she

may have to ask the Board to provide some additional assistance in the amount of \$8,000 to \$9,000.

IN RE: SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS -- REPORT

Dr. Richard Vaughn, Superintendent of Schools, gave a short report on the Midway Elementary gas spill.

IN RE: COUNTY ATTORNEY -- REPORT

Mr. Daniel Siegel, County Attorney, told the Board that he had nothing to report but that he would answer any questions they may have.

IN RE: RECREATION DIRECTOR -- REPORT

Mr. Tony Rinaldi submitted the progress report for the month of November, 1991. He told the Board that he had the bid results for the ballfield lights at Dinwiddie Middle School. Mr. Rinaldi said he had heard that there was a problem with the placement of poles on the field because the physical education classes used the fields. If the poles were placed in the middle of the field where lighting was needed for outfield playing, it would restrict the use of the field by the PE classes.

The Board instructed Mr. Rinaldi to find out if this is definitely a problem and report back to them at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: DIRECTOR OF WASTE MANAGEMENT -- REPORT

Mr. Denny King, Director of Waste Management, submitted his report for the month to the Board. He told the Board that signs had been installed at the dumpster sites and people were destroying them.

The County Administrator said that the RFP's for the co-composting operation at the landfill would be out within the next two weeks.

IN RE: TANK REMOVAL AT SOCIAL SERVICES & HEALTH DEPARTMENT BUILDINGS

The Assistant County Administrator presented the bids for the fuel oil tank removal at the Social Services and Health Department Buildings and advised the Board that the funding had been included in the budget for this year. The bids were as follows:

Because of the close proximity of utility lines, tank removal could be more expensive. Neither proposal includes the cost of clean-up if contamination is found.

IN RE: RECESS

The Chairman declared a recess at 9:10 p.m. The meeting reconvened at 9:20 p.m.

IN RE: COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR COMMENTS

1. The County Administrator stated he had received the specifications from the fire departments for the fire trucks they requested. He said he was in the process of reviewing them and would then ask for the Board's direction. He told the Board he was waiting on the list of bidders and then he would be sending the specs out. He told the Citizens if anyone could assist in the process, their help would be appreciated.

2. The Board was reminded of the appointments that were needed before the end of December.

3. The County Administrator told the Board that VACO's conference for recently elected Board of Supervisors was going to be held in Richmond at the Marriott on January 8-10, 1992.

Upon motion of Mr. Bracey, seconded by Mr. Clay, Mr. Clay, Mr. Moody, Mr. Tickle, Mr. Bracey, Mr. Harrison voting "aye", the travel request for the newly elected Board of Supervisors to attend the VACO conference at the Marriott in Richmond for \$95.00 each was approved.

4. The Board was reminded that they would need to be sworn in at the next meeting on December 18, 1991, by the Clerk of the Circuit Court and that it was necessary for them to have all information filed with the Registrar so the Certificates could be completed before they could take the oath.

5. The Board's annual Legislative Dinner was scheduled for December 18, 1991 at 5:00 P.M. and if that date is not suitable, perhaps a time in January can be arranged.
