

IN RE: READING OF THE MINUTES.

Minutes of the meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Revenue Fund of the County for the month of September, 1961, amounting to \$8063.95 be allowed and checks numbering 1923 through 1928, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the General Revenue Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that the salary of \$208.37 be paid to the Dog Warden and that the claims amounting to \$92.65 be allowed, and checks numbering D-122 through D-130, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the Dog Fund of said County.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT, MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1961.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer having submitted a written financial report same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of September.

IN RE: STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

Mr. B. C. Medlock was present at the Board to hear any requests or complaints concerning the Highway Department.

IN RE: CEDAR HEART FARM PLAT.

A plat of Cedar Heart Farm was presented for approval by the Board concerning the construction of the Presbyterian Church which was referred to the Department of Health for inspection and report at the next meeting.

IN RE: NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING - DOG ORDINANCE RECEIPTS AND TAGS, ETC.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County at a meeting to be held on the 6th day of October, 1961 at 2 o'clock E. S. T. at the agricultural building, proposed to adopt the following ordinance:

Be it ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia,

That dog license receipts shall be carefully preserved by the licensees and exhibited promptly on request for inspection by any Dog Warden, Game Warden or other officer. Dog license tags shall be securely fastened to a substantial collar by the owner or custodian and worn by such dog, and it shall be unlawful for the owner to permit any licensed dog four months old or over to run or roam at large at any time without a license tag, except that when engaged in lawful hunting, in the open season and accompanied by the owner or custodian, the collar and tag may be temporarily removed

If a dog be found running and roaming at large at any time of the year in violation of the above provisions its owner shall pay a fine of not less than two dollars and fifty cents for the first offense and five dollars for each offense thereafter, and, if it is a kennel dog, the license may be revoked if the law appears to the trial court to have been violated by reason of carelessness or negligence on the part of the owner, who shall thereupon be required to secure individual license on each dog.

All persons interested in the above proposed ordinance are hereby invited to attend the said meeting and will be heard either for or against the said proposal.

IN RE: DEPARTMENT OF WELFARE APPEAL OF SLH FOR SUSIE E. BOLLING BY EVA B. BOOSE.

Evan B. Boose, daughter of Susie Z. Boose, deceased, having appeared before the members of the Welfare Board of Dinwiddie County and requested assistance in the payment of a hospital bill to Petersburg General Hospital for the care of Susie E. Boose, now deceased, which Board had denied same to which Eva B. Boose appealed to this Board. And the Board members having heard all the testimony do hereby sustain the welfare board in its denial.

IN RE: HOSPITAL CONTRACTS - UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA.

Mr. Fred H. Tunnell, Superintendent of the Department of Public Welfare for Dinwiddie County having presented a contract for the care of Dinwiddie County indigent patients setting the rate of \$24.65 per patient day, motion was duly made and carried that the same be accepted and executed by L.W. Coleman, Chairman.

IN RE: DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME - OFFICE HOURS.

The Board having adopted in April a resolution directing that the County Offices shall be open at 8 o'clock A.M. and closed at 4 o'clock P.M. Monday through Friday for a period ending October 30, 1961.

After discussion, motion was duly made and carried that this resolution be amended to read that the offices shall be opened at 9 o'clock A.M. and closed at 4 o'clock P.M. Through midnighth, September 30th, 1961, and

Beginning October 1st 1961 the county offices shall open at 9:00 A.M. and close at 5:00 P.M. on regular work days until further notice, and

That beginning October the 6th, regular meetings of this Board shall be held at 2:00 P.M. Eastern Standard Time.

IN RE: OFFICE HOURS OF EMPLOYEES.

Motion was duly made and carried that the constitutional officers schedule their work so that employees will serve a total of 40 hours per week.

IN RE: PRINCE GEORGE - DINWIDDIE COUNTY LINE.

L. W. Coleman, Chairman, reported to the Board that members of this Board along with the Clerk and Commissioner of Revenue met with the Supervisors of Prince George County, Mr. Fred Forberg and Mr. Ernest Curry, representatives of the State Department of Taxation, Mapping Department, on August 8, 1961, at Prince George Court House to discuss the boundary line between Prince George and Dinwiddie and the assessment of property by Prince George Commissioner of Revenue which was formerly assessed in Dinwiddie County.

Mr. Fred Forbert suggested that no action be taken to change the present assessment until his Department had made a study of the property involved from the area maps and field notes available and report to the two Boards, to which all present agreed.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
