IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of September, 1962, amounting to \$ be allowed and checks numbering 1 through 75, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the General Revenue Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that a salary of \$166.66 be paid to the Dog Warden, and that \$105.00 be paid to him as mileage for the month of September, and that claims amounting to \$4.00 be paid out of the Dog Fund of the County for the month of September, and checks numbering D-1 through D-5, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the said Dog Fund of the County. Said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer having submitted a written financial report same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of September, 1962.

IN RE: COAL, TRANSFER TO SCHOOLS.

As several tons of coal were left in the basement after replacing the furnace with an oil burner,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Clerk arrange to have this coal transferred to such school or schools as the Superintendent of Schools may designate.

IN RE: ASSESSMENT OF MINING PROPERTY.

The Commissioner of Revenue having reported that the Supervisor of State Mapping and Appraisal would assist him in assessing mineral property in the County,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Commissioner of Revenue commence this assessment as soon as practical.

IN RE: REPORT OF COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE, ASSESSMENT, 1962.

The Commissioner of Revenue reported that taxes assessed by his office for the year 1962 were as follows:

Personal Property, \$104,349.98, an increase of \$1,300.69  
Real Estate \$265,153.69, an increase of \$7,780.04  
Corporation Tax \$125,036.43, an increase of \$3,730.69.

IN RE: LELIA M. BOONE PLAT.

A plat of 1.1+ acres conveyed to Lelia M. Boone by her father Joseph R. Miles having been presented for approval by this Board and it appearing that this property is a family cut-off, located on Route 672.

Motion was duly made and carried that this plat be approved and the Clerk is directed to admit same to record when so requested.

IN RE: RESOLUTION TO STATE HOSPITAL BOARD - FORT GREGG PROPERTY.

It appearing that the State Department of Highways is contemplating the exchange of certain property located around Fort Gregg with Petersburg National Military Park for certain easements and right of ways, upon the approval of the Governor and the State Hospital Board, and,

The Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County being of the opinion that the property in this particular area is some of the best industrial property in Dinwiddie County, said property being located on Route 142, the Seaboard Airline Railway and the Richmond Petersburg Turnpike,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Governor and the State Hospital Board be and hereby are requested to reserve the property from 100 feet of the east line of the Fort Gregg property to the Seaboard Airline Railway property.

IN RE: PETERSBURG GENERAL HOSPITAL CONTRACT, INDIGENT PATIENTS.

A contract with Petersburg General Hospital to provide hospitalization and treatment of indigent or medically indigent persons at a rate of \$21.95 per patient day having been submitted,

Motion was duly made and carried that the contract be accepted by the Board and executed by its Chairman.

IN RE: DOG TAGS, INCREASE.

It appearing to the Board that an additional dog warden will be needed to take care of the growing dog problem in the county and that it will be necessary to increase the cost of dog tags,

Motion was duly made and carried that notice be published in the Southside Virginia News of a public hearing to be held on November 2nd, 1962, at 2 o'clock P. M. at the Agricultural Building of Dinwiddie County to hear all persons for or against a proposed ordinance to increase male and unsexed dog tags from \$1.00 to \$2.00; female dog tags from \$3.00 to \$4.00; 15 dog kennel tags from \$15.00 to \$20.00; and a 50 dog kennel tags from \$25.00 to \$30.00.

IN RE: HUNTING IN SUBDIVISIONS, ORDINANCE.

M. G. Chandler having requested that some action be taken to prohibit the hunting with fire arms in the vicinity of subdivisions and it appearing that an ordinance for this purpose requires the posting of signs showing the boundary of such subdivisions,

Motion was duly made and carried that any action on an ordinance for this purpose be tabled at the present time.

IN RE: JAIL FARM CONTRACT, COMMITTEE.

The Sheriff having reported that the County jail was over crowded and it being suggested that the Chairman of the Board appoint a committee of three to meet with the Petersburg officials for the purpose of securing a contract with the City of Petersburg to confine prisoners for Dinwiddie County, the chairman appointed C. Harrison Zehmer, M. Watkins Booth and A. Hill Burton for this committee.

IN RE: STREET LIGHTS, SOUTHERN PINES AND DINWIDDIE GARDENS.

A report concerning the installation of street lights in Southern Pines and Dinwiddie Gardens having been presented,

Motion was duly made and carried that no action be taken at this time.

IN RE: POLICE CAR BIDS AND AWARD.

Motion was duly made and carried that Ted Curry Motors, Inc. be awarded the order.

IN RE: HONORABLE M. WATKINS BOOTH, COMMONWEALTH'S ATTORNEY.

Hon. M. Watkins Booth newly appointed Commonwealth's Attorney attended the meeting and was welcomed by the Board members.

IN RE: CONFINING DOGS, OPEN MEETING AND AUTO GRAVEYARDS.

The Commonwealth's Attorney was requested to make a study of ordinances to regulate auto graveyards, open meetings and confining dogs and make a report of his findings at the November meeting.

IN RE: RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION TO D. CARLETON MAYES.

Honorable D. Carleton Mayes having resigned to become Judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit the Chairman appoints M. Watkins Booth and H. B. Batte to present a suitable resolution expressing the appreciation of the Board for his services as Commonwealth's Attorney at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: NEW RATE OF MEMBERSHIP DUES, LEAGUE OF VIRGINIA COUNTIES.

WHEREAS in 1945 it was found necessary to increase the contribution or dues of the member counties to support the activities of the League of Virginia Counties; and

WHEREAS since 1945 the membership dues in the League of Virginia Counties have been paid on the basis of one cent per capita for each member county based on such county's current census population up to a ceiling of \$300.00; and

WHEREAS the expenditures of the League of Virginia Counties have increased during the 17 years since 1945 both from expanded operations and from the effect of inflation; and

WHEREAS in 1959 a number of the larger counties agreed among themselves to support on a voluntary basis the League's expanded activities and made contributions to assist in the operation of an expanded program; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to place the operations and program of the League of Virginia Counties on a fiscally sound and equitably shared basis;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that this Board petition the Recording Secretary of the League of Virginia Counties to circulate to all members, not less than thirty days before the 1962 Annual Meeting of said League, a proposal to amend Article II (a) of the By-Laws of the League of Virginia Counties as follows:

Delete all of Article II (a) of the By-Laws which reads; "Annual membership dues of a county shall be one per cent per capita, the maximum amount in any case not exceeding three hundred dollars. A county's population shall be determined by the last preceding United States Census."

Substituting therefor the following as Article II (a) of the By-Laws; "The annual membership dues of a county shall be one cent per capita on the first 5000 population, one and one half cent per capita on the next 10,000 population and one and one quarter cent per capita on population in excess of 15,000.

The population of a county shall be determined by the last preceding United States Decennial Census."

IN RE: NEWLY ELECTED OFFICERS OF LEAGUE OF VIRGINIA COUNTIES.

WHEREAS it would appear desirable that the newly elected officers of the League of Virginia Counties assume their respective offices as soon as possible after the League's Annual Meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, petition the Recording Secretary of the League of Virginia Counties to circulate to all members not less than thirty days before the 1962 Annual Meeting of said League a proposal to amend Article IV (c) of the Constitution of the League of Virginia Counties as follows:

Delete all of Article IV (c) of the Constitution of the League of Virginia Counties which reads; "The officers elected at the Annual Meeting shall assume office as of the first day of December following their election and shall hold office until their successors are elected."

Substituting therefor the following; "The officers elected at the Annual Meeting shall be installed and assume office as of the date of their installation at the Annual Meeting, and they shall hold office until their successors are elected and installed."

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
