IN RE: READING OF THE MINUTES.

Minutes of the last meeting were not read but approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Revenue Fund of the County for the month of January 1963, amounting to \$7,870.44 be allowed and checks numbering 1 through 86, both inclusive, be issued, therefore, payable out of the General Revenue Fund of the County, said claims having been submitted and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that a salary of \$166.66 be paid to the Dog Warden, and that \$105.00 be paid to him as mileage for the month of January, and that claims amounting to \$28.50 be paid out of the Dog Fund of the County for the month of January, 1963, and checks numbering D-1 through D-9, both inclusive, be issued, therefore, payable out of the said Dog Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT

F. E. Jones, Treasurer having submitted a written financial report same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of February, 1963.

IN RE: TRANSFER OF FUNDS, AUTO LICENSE ACCOUNT TO GENERAL FUND.

Upon request of F. E. Jones, Treasurer,

Motion was duly made and carried that \$25,000.00 be transferred from the Auto License account to the General Fund Account.

IN RE: ANNEX AREA - VALUE OF PROPERTY AND NUMBER OF SCHOOLS STUDENTS REQUESTED.

The Board having met with representatives from the City of Petersburg concerning the proposed annexation of a part of Dinwiddie County and the Board desiring information as to the value of the property and the number of students living within the area,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Commissioner of Revenue and the Superintendent of Schools furnish this information to the Board as soon as practical.

IN RE: DINWIDDIE JAIL FIRE JANUARY 30, 1963,- ALARM REQUESTED.

A. Hill Burton, Sheriff having reported that a fire in the jail, origin unknown, destroyed two or three hundred dollars worth of supplies on January 30th around 8 P.M. which could have been very disastrous to the jail inmates, as no alarm is within reach of any inmates,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Sheriff submit some plan at the March Board meeting to install an alarm that will be accessible to the jail inmates.

IN RE: PLAT OF CHARLES R. WEBSTER PROPERTY.

A plat of Parcel #1, and Parcel #2 of the Jennie M. Duval property having been presented for approval by the Board and it appearing that this property is located on River Road, (Rt.601) and has been approved by the Health Department.

Motion was duly made and carried that this plat be approved and the Clerk is directed to record the plat when so requested; any building permit on this property must have the prior approval of the Department of Health.

IN RE: PLAT OF JOHN S. TYNES PROPERTY (LOT 4).

A Plat to be recorded with deed #3193 conveying Lot #4 shown on said plat, to Grover C. Williamson and it appearing that said Lot 4 is a parcel of property which is within an area covered by an easement to Virginia Electric and Power Company. Mr. Williamson

acquiring the property to be used as part of his lawn.

Motion was duly made and carried that this plat be approved and the Clerk is directed to record same when so requested.

IN RE: C. W. PEARSON RD. - PETITION FOR SECONDARY SYSTEM

Mr. C. W. Pearson, Church Road, Virginia, and others having requested that a road leading off from Rt. 611 extending a distance of seven tenths of a mile and located about two miles north of Poole Siding be taken into the secondary system.

And it being suggested by the State Highway Resident Engineer that the right of way of the proposed road be staked and a proper easement be executed.

Motion was duly made and carried that the Clerk mail Mr. Pearson an easement form to be executed and filed with this Board for consideration by the Road Viewers to be appointed in April.

IN RE: RT. 40 STUDY AND RELOCATION REQUESTED.

The Board members discussed with Mr. L. R. Treat, Jr. Route 40 and requested that the Highway Department make a study of this road from the entrance in Dinwiddie County through Nottaway County to formulate plans to relocate and improve

IN RE: R. STUART ROYER, CONSULTING ENGINEERS SELECTED.

Representatives from the Consulting Engineering firms of Wiley and Wilson, of Lynchburg and Richmond, John McNair, Waynesboro and R. Stuart Royer of Richmond having appeared before the Board to discuss the proposed water and sewer installation in Rohoic District and the representatives having declined to submit their proposals the discussion was terminated.

After the representatives had left and further discussion by the Board Members, motion was made and carried that R. Stuart Royer and Associates be invited to submit their proposals for consideration by the Board at the March Meeting.

IN RE: HUNTING WITH HIGH POWERED RIFLES IN DINWIDDIE COUNTY

The Commonwealth's Attorney was requested to submit a report on any laws concerning the use of highpowered rifles to hunt game in Dinwiddie County.

IN RE: BUDGET REQUESTS FOR FARM AGENTS; AND CRIPPLE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Requests of \$9,120.00 from the Virginia Agricultural Extension Service and for an appropriation from Cripple Childrens Hospital having been received same were ordered file for consideration when the informative budget is discussed.

IN RE: FORD DEPOT - N & W REQUEST TO CLOSE.

A representative of the Norfolk and Western Railway Co. having appeared before the Board in Executive session and informed the Board that his company would petition the I.C.C. for permission to close their depot in Ford, Virginia. Motion was made and carried that no action be taken by this Board.

IN RE: JEEP - Ford FIRE DEPARTMENT

William E. Morgan chief of Ford Vol. Fire Department having requested the County to purchase a surplus Jeep through the State Board of Education for their fire department, this request was referred to the County Civil Defense Coordinator.
