IN RE: EXECUTIVE SECRETARY:

The Board having set this day to interview any applicants desiring to appear in person to present their qualifications as an Executive Secretary, and,

The Board having heard all present.

Motion was duly made and carried that Terrell Baskerville be employed as Executive Secretary beginning April 1st, 1965 at a salary of \$6,000.00 per year.

IN RE: BUDGET 1965-1966

Copies of the County Budget were presented to each member for study and consideration at the April meeting.

IN RE: POLICE CARS - AUCTION SALE.

The Sheriff having offered the police cars for sale at public auction on March 20th, 1965 at 1 P.M. and the total offer for three (3) cars being \$1,130.00, subject to this Boards approval,

Motion was duly made and carried that the sales of the three (3) cars for \$1,130.00 be disapproved, and

The Sheriff is directed to offer these cars for sale again at public auction on April 7th at 5:30 P.M. after advertising same.

IN RE: JAMES RIVER BASIN - MEETING.

The State Department of Highways having designated March 31, 1965 at 1:30 P.M. at the Highway Building, Richmond, Virginia as the time and place for a public hearing on the James River Basin project.

M. G. Chandler and H.B. Batte were designated to represent the County at this meeting.

IN RE: REPAIRS TO AGRICULTURAL BUILDING.

Kenbridge Construction Company having submitted suggestions and a price for brick veneering the back of the Agricultural Building,

Motion was duly made and carried that this be referred to Mr. Bedwell for report at the next meeting.

IN RE: SEWERAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM - HEALTH BUILDING.

L. C. Harrison, Jr., County Sanitarian having submitted plans and suggestions for connecting the Education Building Sewerage Disposal System to the Health Building System, same were referred to B. F. Bedwell .

IN RE: SALES TAX.

WHEREAS, the constant increase in the cost of County Government has created a situation that has become intolerable, since the counties have exhausted all sources of revenue and continue to go deeper in debt, and if more cities are forced to pass local sale taxes whereby the cities receive all the revenue collected, the passage of a general state sales tax by the Legislature will be impossible since legislators representing the cities will not vote to share with the state the revenue collected by the cities from a local sales tax.

WHEREAS, the League of Virginia Counties has advocated a general state sales tax, but to no avail, since no Governor, after he has been elected, has recommended its passage to the Legislature.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the League of Virginia counties is urged to recommend to its member counties that they support no candidate for Governor of any political party until such candidate states publicly and without equivocation what his recommendation to the Legislature will be if he is elected as to the passage of a general state sales tax.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be mailed to League of Virginia Counties, and the representatives to the State Government from Dinwiddie County.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
