IN RE: READING OF MINUTES.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of April, 1965 amounting to \$9,486.42 be allowed and checks numbering 65-306 to 65-414, both inclusive, be issued, therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County, said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salary of \$355.00 be paid to the Dog Warden for the month of April, 1965 and that claims amounting to \$52.00 be allowed and checks numbering D-65-24, to D-65-31, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the Dog Fund of the County, said claims have been investigated by the Dog Warden and approved for payment by the Board.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer, having submitted a written financial report, same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of May, 1965.

IN RE: HEALTH DIRECTOR.

Dr. W. R. Ferguson reported to the Board that \$194.44 would be returned to the general fund as unused funds for the 64-65 year. Dr. Ferguson requested that the City of Hopewell be admitted to the Health District. The Board discussed same and,

Motion was duly made and carried that Dinwiddie had no objection to the admission of the City of Hopewell.

IN RE: EDUCATIONAL BUILDING.

Mr. George C. Hodge, Superintendent of Schools, appeared before the Board and requested that conduits for telephone wires be installed when the electrical work is done,

Motion was duly made and carried directing Mr. B. F. Bedwell to have electrical contractor install conduits for telephone lines and to also contract for electrical fixtures, venetian blinds, and other necessary equipment.

IN RE: REASSESSMENT 1966.

Mr. R. W. Bridgman, Commissioner of Revenue appeared before the Board and requested that the Board request state personnel to make the general reassessment in 1966,

Motion was duly made and carried directing the Executive Secretary to contact the Virginia Department of Taxation requesting same, all members voting positive.

IN RE: APPOMATTOX RIVER WATER AUTHORITY.

At the request of the Board Mr. L. R. Treat, Jr. District Engineer, Virginia Department of Highways, appeared before the Board to discuss problems arising from the new Appomattox Lake,

Motion was duly made and carried directing the Executive Secretary and Commonwealth's Attorney to draw up a resolution notifying the Appomattox River Water Authority that Dinwiddie County

would not be liable for flooding or damage to our secondary roads by the Lake.

IN RE: BUDGET 1965-66.

It appearing to the Board that no one appeared at the public hearing on the Budget to make their desires known,

Motion was duly made and carried that the following budget be adopted for the fiscal year 1965-66:

IN RE: RESOLUTION - SOUTHSIDE AREA TECHNICAL SCHOOL.

Col. Fox, Project Manager, for the Southside Area Technical School appeared before the Board and requested that the Board support the said school by resolution,

Motion was duly made and carried that the following resolution be forwarded to Col. Fox to be presented to the State Board of Technical Education:

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, aware of the need of the establishment of a Technical College in the Southside Virginia, and,

WHEREAS, Southside Virginia is well endowed for future industrial development and that the need for training for our young people is necessary to induce new industry,

WHEREAS, Dinwiddie County, by resolution, having already contributed to the Chesterfield Area Technical School and realizing the need of a Technical School near the Southwestern portion of the County,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board express its interest in and to cooperate with the adjoining counties in Southside Virginia in the establishment of a Technical College in Southside Virginia, and that this Board at the proper time will consider the financial contribution it will give to this college.

IN RE: RESOLUTION - CIVIL WAR COMMISSION.

After discussion,

Motion was duly made and carried directing H. Barner Batte and Terrell Baskerville to draw up resolution to be presented to the Civil War Commission expressing the Board's appreciation for their work.

IN RE: STREET LIGHTS - DUNEDIN.

Petition having been submitted by the Miami Construction Company, 6708 Dartmouth Ave., Richmond 26, Virginia for the installation of street lights in the Dunedin Subdivision and in keeping with the Board's policy, same was deferred until such time as the streets in the Dunedin Subdivision were taken into the secondary road system.

IN RE: SCENIC ROADS COMMITTEE.

Motion was duly made and carried the following named persons, with their consent, are appointed to serve on the Scenic Roads Committee to work with the Hon. Jack H. Temple, Mr. L. L. Meredith, Mr. R. E. Skinner, Mr. Ivan Butterworth. (Mr. Butterworth declining due to lack of time.)

IN RE: BUILDING CODE.

After lengthy discussion concerning the needs of a building, plumbing and electrical code,

Motion was duly made and carried directing the Dinwiddie County Planning Commission to submit recommendations of same at the regular June Meeting.

IN RE: TRAILER PARK PERMIT - JAMES A. MUSGROVE.

Mr. James A. Musgrove appeared before the Board requesting a use permit to construct a Mobile Home Park on Parcel 21-99 located east of Highway #1,

Motion was duly made and carried granting use permit to Mr. Musgrove with following conditions:

1. Park must conform with all Dinwiddie County Health Department Regulations.
2. Park must conform with all State Water Control Board Regulation.
3. Park must comply with provisions of the Dinwiddie County Zoning Ordinance.

IN RE: TRAILER PERMIT - J. W. ADKINS AND J. A. TOWNSEND.

Motion was duly made and carried granting use permits to J. W. Adkins and J.A. Townsend to locate trailers on their property on Highway #613 with conditions that all requirements of the Dinwiddie County Health Department and Dinwiddie County Trailer Ordinance are complied with.

IN RE: ZONING - APPOMATTOX LAKE.

It appearing to the Board that strict zoning around the new Appomattox Lake is necessary to prevent undesirable activities along the shore line, same was discussed and referred to the Planning Commr.

IN RE: DOG FOOD.

A. W. Chappell, Dog Warden, appeared before the board and stated that sometimes it is necessary to house dogs over night, after discussion,

Motion was duly made and carried authorizing Mr. Chappell to purchase 100 lbs of dog food to feed said dogs, such food charged against the dog fund.

IN RE: RESOLUTION - SCHOOLS AVERAGE DAILY ENROLMENT.

After lengthy discussion with George M. Hodge, Superintendent of Schools,

Motion was duly made and carried directing Terrell Baskerville and Mr. Hodge to draw up a resolution to be presented to Del. Roy Smith, Del. Arthur Richardson, Sen. Jack Temple, Sen. Joe Hutchinson, Mr. George Long and The State Board of Education, requesting that legislative action be taken so that appropriations will be made to local School Boards on a formula using Average Daily Membership rather than Average Daily Attendance.

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors of the County of Dinwiddie, having reviewed the method of distribution by which the local school boards of the Commonwealth of Virginia receive reimbursement from the State Board of Education on Average Daily Attendance, and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors feel that this is an unsatisfactory method of distribution, particularly to rural areas, where inclement weather hampers attendance,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the said Board of Supervisors do request that necessary legislation be enacted at the next meeting of the General Assembly by which the formula using Average Daily Attendance be revised to a formula using Average Daily Enrolment.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned until May 11th, 1965 at 3:00 P.M.
