IN RE: READING OF MINUTES.

Minutes of the Regular May 5, 1965 meeting were read and approved. Minutes of the continued May 11, 1965 meeting were read and approved subject to the following addition:

IN RE: BOND REFERENDUM.

The Board in previous action, having authorized the School Board to borrow \$400,000 from the Literary Fund and/or Virginia Supplement Retirement Fund for the construction of an elementary school in West Petersburg and after lengthy discussion about the proposed referendum and bond issue to renovate the court-house and clerk's office and to construct a finance building, & jail.

Motion was duly made that the Board continue with the referendum and bond issue for the construction and renovation. Motion was not seconded.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of May 1965 amounting to \$34,969.92 be allowed and checks numbering 65-415 to 65-510, both inclusive, be issued, therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County, said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salary of \$355.00 be paid to the Dog Warden for the month of May 1965 and that claims amounting to \$146.40 be allowed and checks numbering D-65-32 to D-65-42, both inclusive be issued, therefor, payable out of the Dog Fund of the County, said claims have been investigated by the Dog Warden and approved for payment by the Board.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer, having submitted a written financial report, same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of June, 1965.

IN RE: PUPIL PLACEMENT BOARD.

After notice having been published in the Southside Virginia News of a hearing on this date for the purpose of passing an ordinance to withdraw from the Pupil Placement Board and after no one appeared to express their views,

Motion was duly made and carried that the following ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE PERMITTING THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF DINWIDDIE TO WITHDRAW FROM THE STATE PUPIL PLACEMENT BOARD OF VIRGINIA.

It appearing to the Board of Supervisors that a notice advising the residents of the County of Dinwiddie that this Board would consider the passing of the following ordinance at its meeting to be held on June 2, 1965 at 2:00 P.M. was duly published in the Southside Virginia News as required by law.

Therefore be it ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, pursuant to the act or acts of the General Assembly of Virginia and the statutes of the Commonwealth of Virginia in such cases made and provided,

That the School Board of the County of Dinwiddie, Virginia, be and it is hereby granted permission to withdraw from the jurisdiction of the State Pupil Placement Board of Virginia,

And the Clerk of this Board is hereby directed to deliver to G.M. Hodge, Superintendent of Schools for the County of Dinwiddie a certified copy of this ordinance.

IN RE: COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE ORDINANCE.

After notice having been published in the Southside Virginia News of a hearing on this date for the purpose of adopting a Compulsory Attendance Ordinance and after no one appeared to express their views,

Motion was duly made and carried that said ordinance be tabled indefinitely.

IN RE: WELFARE HOSPITAL CLAIMS.

Mr. L. W. Coleman, brought to the attention of the Board that the Board should investigate some of the hospital bills being presented to the Board for payment by the Welfare Department, after discussion that some of the hospital bills amount to nearly \$1,000.00,

Motion was duly made and carried directing the Welfare Superintendent to present to the Board of Supervisors the cases for review before payment by the Board.

IN RE: DRAINFIELDS.

Motion was duly made and carried directing Executive Secretary to secure bids for installation of new drainfields for the Educational Building as per Health Department permit dated March 10, 1965 and to accept the lowest bid.

IN RE: WEST PETERSBURG SCHOOL LAND.

The Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Hodge, appeared before the Board and requested that the School Board be authorized to contract for the land upon which the new school will be built. Mr. Hodge stated that the School Board has negotiated with Norfolk and Western Railroad for 33 acres but had not obtained a price. He stated also that the School Board had an option on another tract which was suitable, after discussion,

Motion was duly made and carried authorizing the School Board to purchase the land at a price they feel reasonable.

IN RE: TRAILER PERMIT - L. E. BISHOP.

Mr. L. E. Bishop appeared before the board and requested that he be issued a use permit to place a trailer on land he is purchasing along Vaughan's Road. It was brought to the attention of the board that Mr. Bishop's land was in the area presently under petition to be rezoned from A-2 to R-1,

Motion was duly made and carried to table Mr. Bishop's request until the rezoning is settled in July.

IN RE: PLAT - B. HUNTER BARROW.

A Plat submitted by the Hon. B. Hunter Barrow to sell (1) acre of land to a life long tenant on Rt. #672 was approved by the Board.

IN RE: DRIVEWAY.- EDUCATIONAL BUILDING

After discussion about constructing a driveway behind the new Educational Building with Mr. B. C. Medlock,

Motion was duly made and carried requesting the Highway Department to submit prices on preparation of the said driveway.

IN RE: AIR CONDITIONERS.

Bids having been received on air conditioners for the courtroom and clerk's office, and being reviewed by the board,

IN RE: ROAD VIEWERS - REPORT 1965.

Mr. B. C. Medlock, Assistant Resident Engineer Virginia Department of Highways presented the following report of the Board of Viewers.

Board of Viewers Report

Dinwiddie County
May 4, 1965

The Board of Viewers of Dinwiddie County met at 10:00 a.m. on May 4, 1965 at Dinwiddie Courthouse and viewed the following roads with recommendations as shown below:

Draper Road:

The Board of Viewers viewed a road known as Draper Road beginning at a point on Route 644, 2.10 miles east of Route 610 running in a northerly direction, 0.70 mile to dead end. This road serves three houses. The Board of Viewers recommended that 0.43 mile be recommended for addition at this time, with the provision that the property owners furnish a 40' right of way with proper survey. Estimated maintainable cost \$500. Construction Cost \$1,500.

Wright Road:

The Board of Viewers viewed a road known as Wright Road beginning at a point at Route 613, 1.53 miles west of Route 622 running in a northerly direction 0.70 mile to dead end. This road serves four houses. The Board of Viewers recommended that this road be taken into the secondary system with the provision that the property owners furnish to the county a 40' right of way with proper survey. Estimated maintainable cost \$500. Construction Cost \$2,000.

Chandler Bethune Road:

The Board of Viewers viewed a road known as the Chandler Bethune Road beginning at a point at Route 727, 0.62 mile easterly and southerly from Route 675 running in a southerly direction approximately 0.18 mile to dead end. This is an extension of Route 727. It serves three houses. The Board of Viewers recommended that this proposed road be added to the secondary system of Dinwiddie County and the provisions that the property owners furnish to the county a 40' right of way and proper survey. Estimated maintainable cost \$300. Construction Cost \$600.

Crowder Road:

The Board of Viewers viewed a road known as the Crowder Road beginning at a point on Route 600 approximately 0.10 mile north of Route 601 running in a southerly direction to dead end and which is the intersection of a proposed 50' street which runs west. The approximate length of this proposed addition is 0.10 mile. The Board of Viewers recommended that this be taken into the secondary system with the provision that the property owners furnish to the county a 50' right of way with proper survey and plat. Estimated maintainable cost \$200. Construction Cost. \$800.

WHEREAS, the members of the Civil War Centennial Commission have represented Dinwiddie County with utmost esteem,



WHEREAS, the Commission having dedicated the pole in the courtyard from which our national banner flies and having erected signs of historical nature along the county's highways,


WHEREAS, the Commission having concluded their work with the erection of a commemorative monument at Five Forks in honor of the 100th anniversary of the Battle of Five Forks.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be presented to each individual member and a copy be placed in the official records of the county.

Motion was duly made and carried directing Executive Secretary to have a plaque painted which could be bolted to the car door and used over again.


IN RE: REZONING - SQUIRREL LEVEL ROAD AND VAUGHAN ROAD.


IN RE: BUILDING CODE.
