

VIRGINIA: AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF  
DINWIDDIE COUNTY HELD AT THE AGRICULTURAL BUILDING  
JULY 7, 1965 AT 2:00 P.M.

IN RE: READING OF MINUTES.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, subject to minor correction.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of June, 1965 amounting to \$20,751.01 be allowed and checks numbering 65-511 to 65-613, both inclusive, be issued, therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County, said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARY AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salary of \$355.00 be paid to the Dog Warden for the month of June, 1965 and that claims amounting to \$85.54 be allowed and checks numbering D-65-43 to D-65-50, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the Dog Fund of the County, said claims have been investigated by the Dog Warden and approved for payment by the Board.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT.

W. E. Bolte, Deputy Treasurer, having submitted a written financial report, same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of July, 1965.

IN RE: CIVIL WAR CENTENNIAL COMMISSION.

Motion was duly made and carried that the resolution adopted at the regular June meeting be printed and framed and presented to the members.

IN RE: DIRECTOR OF HEALTH.

Dr. Ferguson, Director of Health, reported that Mrs. Frances T. Hoffman resigned June 30, 1965 and that two experienced applicants are presently being screened for the opening.

IN RE: SHERIFFS REPORT JULY, 1965.

Sheriff A. H. Burton reported that he attended the National Sheriff's Convention in Atlantic City, N.J. June 27-30.

IN RE: WELFARE BUDGET.

Supt. of Welfare Mrs. King B. Talley reported that the Welfare budget of \$81,810.00 had been approved by the State Welfare Department of which local funds amounted to \$16,785.00 which was an increase of \$174.00 over the amount previously approved by the Board.

Motion was duly made and carried appropriating extra \$174.00 to the Welfare Budget.

IN RE: ROADS MEETING, 1965.

Mr. H.A. Fennell, Resident Engineer reported that this was the annual roads meeting with the Board. Individual Board members questioned Mr. Fennell on certain highway projects.

IN RE: WALNUT TREES.

Mr. Clyde Tate, Rt. 1 Austinville, Virginia notified the Board that he is willing to pay \$100.00 for three (3) Walnut Trees behind the Agricultural Building. Offer was refused.

IN RE: A.S.C.S. LEASE.

Motion was duly made and carried that the lease for the A.S.C.S office consisting of 1356 sq. ft. of office space in the Agricultural Building containing four (4) rooms and a lobby for an annual rental of \$1,008.00 payable \$84.00 per month be renewed, said lease to be executed by A. Mitchell Smith, Chairman.

IN RE: L.G.O.C. - 1965.

It was brought to the attention of the Board that the annual L.G.O.C. is to be held in Charlottesville, Virginia August 30, 31 and September 1,

Motion was duly made and carried that each attending official of Dinwiddie County be authorized no more than \$40.00 for expenses.

IN RE: TRAILER AND/OR ZONING ORDINANCE AMMENDMENT.

Supervisor Meredith suggested to the Board that some action should be taken to prevent trailers from moving into Rhoic District either by ammending the Zoning Ordinance or the Trailer Ordinance. The Commonwealth's Attorney was directed to draw up the ammendments.

IN RE: JOSEPH L. SZABO - TRAILER PARK PERMIT.

Mr. Joseph L. Szabo, 217 Duke Drive, Chesapeake, Virginia, appeared before the Board with preliminary plans for a Trailer Park in Spony District. Such park to be located 2 miles north of McKenney on U.S. #1 on parcel #81-13,

Motion was duly made and carried directing the Executive Secretary to issue conditional use permit provided such park conforms with the Health Department regulations and the Zoning Ordinance.

IN RE: REFUND APPOMATTOX RIVER WATER AUTHORITY.

A check for \$2,000.00 payable to the County of Dinwiddie was accepted by the Board as a refund of \$2,000.00 loaned to the Appomattox River Water Authority in 1961 to get started.

IN RE: E. L. MARECK - VACANT LOT.

Attention of the Board having been directed to a vacant lot near the home of Mr. E. L. Mareck which was grown up in weeds and the Board seeing a need for an ordinance to control such vacant lots, The Commonwealth's Attorney was directed by motion duly made and carried to further investigate the possibilities of such an ordinance.

IN RE: RESTROOMS - SOUND PROOF

It having been brought to the attention of the Board of the necessity of soundproofing the Ladies rest room in the Agricultural Building same was referred to Mr. Bedwell for future consideration.

IN RE: STREET LIGHTS - WESTERN HILLS.

Petition having been received from the citizens of Western Hills requesting street lights on Halcum Drive & Duke Drive, the Secretary was directed to contact Vepco on the petition.

IN RE: HOSPITAL CONTRACTS - UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA AND MEDICAL COLLEGE OF VIRGINIA.

A new contract effective July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966 with the Medical College of Virginia and the University of Virginia for the treatment of indigent persons at the rate of \$30.71 per patient day having been presented,

Motion was duly made and carried that this contract be and is hereby approved by this Board and the Chairman is directed to execute same.

IN RE: THE SCHOOL BOARD - APPROPRIATION.

The School Board having presented request for an appropriation of \$6,000 to purchase land for a school site ½ mile north of U.S.#1 at the end of State Route #634,

Motion was duly made and carried approving same provided the School Board approves the location for the school.

IN RE: LITERARY LOAN.

The Board in previous action having authorized the School Board to apply for a Literary loan of \$400,000 to replace the West Petersburg School after purchasing the site upon which to build the School adopted the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The School Board for the County of Dinwiddie on the 7th day of July presented to this Board, an application addressed to the State Board of Education of Virginia for the purpose of borrowing from the Literary Fund \$400,00 for the new School Building to replace West Petersburg School or for adding to or improving the School Buildings at Southside Elementary and/or Northside Elementary School, to be paid in 30 annual installments, and the interest thereon at 3 per cent paid annually,

RESOLVED, That the the application of the County School Board to the State Board of Education of Virginia for a loan of \$400,000 from the Literary Fund is hereby approved, and authority is hereby granted the said County School Board to borrow the said amount for the purpose set out in said application.

The Board of Supervisors for said County will each year during the life of this loan, at the time they fix the regular levies, fix a rate of levy for schools or make a cash appropriation sufficient for operation expenses and to pay this loan in annual installments and the interest thereon, as required by law regulating loans from the Literary Fund.

IN RE: WELFARE CAR.

The Board having noted that there was a misunderstanding as to the Welfare employees driving the Welfare car home, directed that the car may be driven home by the employees provided such employee has business to attend to either going home or returning the next day.

IN RE: SCHOOL BOARD OFFICE BUILDING.

The Board examined the new School Board Office Building and noted two minor discrepancies. It was decided not to formally accept the building until these discrepancies were corrected.

IN RE: AMPLIFIER.

Mr. Pete Thrower, brought to the Board's attention that citizens attending the Board meeting had difficulty in hearing the business transactions,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Secretary investigate the possibility of installing an amplifier in the meeting hall.

IN RE: CHANGE IN MEETING PLACE.

Motion was duly made and carried that due to the recent installation of air conditioning in the Courtroom the future meetings of the Board of Supervisors will be held in the Dinwiddie County Courtroom, and Secretary was directed to advertise same.

IN RE: SEPTEMBER MEETING.

It was brought to the attention of the Board that the regular date for the September 1965 meeting conflicted with the L.G.O.C. dates therefore,

Motion was duly made and carried that the September, 1965 meeting be held September 8, 1965 in lieu of September 1 and the Secretary was directed to advertise same.

IN RE: RESOLUTION - SCENIC HIGHWAY.

Upon motion duly made and carried the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors in a regular meeting held on July 7, 1965, at Dinwiddie, Virginia, took cognizance of the fact that the National Park Service is now planning a "Scenic and Historic Route" beginning at Washington, D. C., travelling southward to Yorktown and then westerly to Appomattox.

WHEREAS, Dinwiddie County has several primary and secondary routes that are ideally located for such a project.

WHEREAS, Dinwiddie County was the scene of the Battle of Five Forks, where 40,000 of the most gallant and courageous men this country has ever produced took part in this battle, of which 6,000 were killed, wounded and captured. Also this county was the scene of forty-eight other battles, engagements, and skirmishes and has over fifty miles of fortifications and sixty forts and batteries. The birthplace of General Winfield Scott is located here and his law office still stands.

WHEREAS, most of the original battlefields, with the original fortifications, are still intact and on the site of the Battle of Five Forks, the original Gilliam House (Burnt Quarter) still stands unchanged.

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has passed a law to permit the National Park Service to acquire the necessary acreage at the site of the Battle of Five Forks to adequately tell and portray the story of this great battle.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we respectfully request the National Park Service to take the necessary steps to secure the proposed "Scenic and Historic Route" to run through the County of Dinwiddie in order for more of the public to view this great historic area of our Country.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Director of the National Park Service, Senator Harry F. Byrd and Senator A. Willis Robertson, Hon. Watkins M. Abbitt, State Senator John H. Temple.

IN RE: REZONING SQUIRREL LEVEL ROAD AND VAUGHANS ROAD

Notice having been duly published in the Progress-Index as prescribed by law of a public hearing set July 7, 1965 at 4:00 PM at which time the public would be heard on Rezoning along Squirrel Level Road (#613) and Vaughan's Road (#675), and the board having heard all present,

Motion was duly made and carried rezoning the designated area as outlined per map from Agricultural A-2 to Residential R-1.

IN RE: SAND AND GRAVEL PIT ORDINANCE

The board's attention having been called to the necessity of regulating sand and gravel pits so that undue hazards will not be created in the construction of Interstate 85 and

Upon motion duly made and carried the board adopted an emergency amendment to the Zoning Ordinance regulating sand and gravel pits. This amendment is section 17 and becomes effective the first day after the second publication in a local newspaper for a period of 60 days. A copy of said amendment is on file in the Clerk's Office.

IN RE: TRAILER PERMIT - L. E. BISHOP


Mr. L. E. Bishop having appeared before the Board at the regular June meeting requesting a trailer permit on Vaughan's Road, same being deferred until after the Rezoning decision of same area from A-2 to R-1, and the area having been rezoned in previous action of this meeting, request was denied.

IN RE: INGLESIDE SUBDIVISION - DINWIDDIE COURT STREET.

A street beginning at a point on Route 613 0.13 miles north of Route 142 running in a westerly direction 0.23 miles to dead end. This street was viewed by the Board of Viewers of Dinwiddie County and they unanimously agreed that this street be taken in under the Highway Commission's Rural Additions Policy of the Department of Highways of March 19, 1964. Since this subdivision was platted and put to record Nov. 10, 1952 having a duly recorded 50' Right of Way in width recorded in Plat Book 2, Page 95 dated Nov. 10, 1952 and D.B. 124 Page 119 dated July 6, 1965. The Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County having discussed with the resident Engineer the policy whereas the original subdivider has no further interest in the subdivision and all lots are individually owned and whereas the property owners along this street have deposited \$700.00 with the Board of Supervisors to pay their proportionate part for construction, in accordance with the Rural Additions Policy.

Motion was duly made and carried requesting the Virginia Department of Highways to take into the secondary system Dinwiddie Court Street as described above.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
