IN RE: ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN 1966 - A.M. SMITH.

Upon motion of M. G. Chandler, seconded by L. W. Coleman and properly passed Mr. A. Mitchell Smith was elected Chairman of the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors for the year of 1966.

Upon motion of M. G. Chandler, seconded by L. W. Coleman and properly passed Mr. L. L. Meredith was elected Vice-Chairman of the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors for the year 1966.

IN RE: READING OF MINUTES.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of December, 1965 amounting to \$14,507.59 be allowed and checks numbering 66-1 thru 66-185, both inclusive, be issued, therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County, said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARY AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salary of \$355.00 be paid to the Dog Warden for the month of December, 1965 and that claims and accounts amounting to \$78.05 be allowed and checks numbering D-66-1 to D-66-9, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the Dog Fund of the County, said claims have been investigated by the Dog Warden and approved for payment by the Board.

IN RE: CUSTODIAN OF BUILDINGS.

Mr. William Bristow, representative of V. Lee Parker & Co. presented to and discussed with the Board the audit of the County for the year ending June 30, 1965.


IN RE: AUDIT BY V. LEE PARKER YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1966.

RESOLUTION




WHEREAS, the subject bid at public auction has not been approved by Decree of the Circuit Court of Dinwiddie County; and





IN RE: BOARD OF EQUALIZATION (ASSESSORS).

The Board of Assessors of S. E. Winn, Clifford Reese, R. H. Spiers, O. L. Birdsall, and Garland Watkins and Mr. S. E. Fraher, County Assessor, and Mr. Fred Forberg, Director of the Division of Real Estate Appraisal and Mapping met with the Board of Supervisors and discussed the general reassessment for 1966. The salary of the Board of Assessors was set at \$20.00 per day, which includes traveling and eating expenses.

IN RE: NAMOZINE VOL. FIRE DEPARTMENT-REFUND CHECK.

A check for \$100.00 made payable to the Namozine Vol. Fire Department for trade in of six (6) tires was authorized to be kept by the Fire Department to be deposited in the Treasury.

IN RE: COMMONWEALTH'S ATTORNEY DESK.

Chandler and properly carried a new desk was authorized to be purchased for the Commonwealth's Attorney's Office, such desk to be purchased from the Penitentiary Industrial Department with the approval of the Compensation Board.

IN RE: FIRE CONTRACT - TOWN OF MCKENNEY.

It appearing to the Board that contract with the Town of McKenney for fire service expired December 31st and should be renewed,

Motion was duly made and carried that this contract be renewed, said contract among other things stating that \$600.00 is the basic charge for ten (10) fires with \$50.00 for each additional fire thereafter.

IN RE: BOND ISSUE 1965 DEFEATED.

The certified results of the referendum held December 14, 1965 were 773 votes against bond issue, 406 votes for and 5 votes void.
