

VIRGINIA: AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF
DINWIDDIE COUNTY HELD AT THE AGRICULTURAL BUILDING
OF SAID COUNTY ON THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1966 AT 8:00 P.M.

IN RE: READING OF MINUTES:

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved without being read.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of October, 1966 amounting to \$10,872.87 be allowed and checks numbering 66-1247 thru 66-1373, both inclusive, be issued, therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County and said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: LOCAL SALES TAX - TOWN OF MCKENNEY.

The Board was informed that the State Sales Tax Act passed by the 1966 Virginia General Assembly directed that one half of the localities' revenue from their one percent local sales tax must be distributed to incorporated towns in the locality on a basis directly proportionate to the number of school age population in the town as compared to the school age population of the entire county.

Figures supplied by the Dinwiddie County School Board show that 150 school age children resided in the Town of McKenney as compared to 5,583 children in the County.

The Board was further informed that the Town of McKenney would receive 2.69% of one half on Dinwiddie County's revenue from the local sales tax.

IN RE: PUPIL SCHOLARSHIPS 1966-67.

Mr. George Hodge, Superintendent of Schools presented a request for authorization to pay pupil placement scholarships for 30 children. Mr. Meredith stated that schools are provided for these children in this county and moved that the Board of Supervisors do not pay pupil scholarships for the years 1966-67. There was no seconded.

Mr. Hauser moved that this Board appropriate funds for 30 pupil placement scholarships to be paid when presented to the Treasurer after approved by the School Board, Mr. Winn seconded. The motion carried 3-1 (Mr. Hauser, Mr. Winn, Mr. Smith, voted "yes", Mr. Meredith voted "no").

IN RE: MIDWAY SCHOOL FIRE - LOST BOOKS.

Mr. Hodge, Supt. of Schools stated that parents of children who had lost books in the fire at Midway Elementary School November 8th had requested that the School Board reimburse them for the lost books. The School Board cited that it had no funds for such reimbursement & relayed the information to the Board of Supervisors. Mr. Meredith moved that this Board take no action until presented a specific request. Mr. Hauser seconded. Motion carried.

IN RE: HUNTING IN CONGESTED AREAS-EMERGENCY ORDINANCE.

The Board having directed at its November 2, meeting that an ordinance be prepared to regulate hunting in the congested North-eastern portion of Rohoic District was presented the said ordinance.

Mr. Meredith moved that said ordinance be adopted immediately as an emergency ordinance. Mr. Winn seconded and the following ordinance was passed unanimously effective November 16, 1966 for a period of sixty (60) days:

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING HUNTING WITH FIREARMS OR OTHER WEAPONS
PARTS OF ROHOIC DISTRICT, DINWIDDIE COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, pursuant to the act or acts of the General Assembly of Virginia and the statutes of the Commonwealth of Virginia that it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt with any type or kind of firearms or other weapons in the following areas of Rohoic District, Dinwiddie County, Virginia, to-wit:

All that part of Rohoic Magisterial District, Dinwiddie County, Virginia lying north of the Military Park Road (Defense Road) beginning at a point where said road leaves the City of Petersburg and enters Dinwiddie County, thence along said road in a westerly direction to its intersection with Boydton Plank Road (Rt. 142), thence along said Boydton Plank Road in a Westerly direction to its intersection with the Seaboard Airline Railroad, thence in a southerly direction along said railroad to its intersection with the Norfolk and Western Railroad Beltline, thence westerly along said Norfolk and Western Beltline to its intersection with the main line of the Norfolk & Western Railroad, thence in a straight line in a northerly direction to the Appomattox River.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors that this ordinance shall not infringe upon the rights of an owner of land in said area of sufficient size to hunt on his or her own land provided such hunting will not endanger the lives of persons living in or near said lands.

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors that any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$300.00 and imprisonment in the County jail not exceeding 30 days, such violators shall be tried before the County Court in like manner and with the right of appeal as if such violations were misdemeanors.

And it appearing to the Board of Supervisors that an emergency exists due to the fact that the hunting season in Virginia opens on November 21st, this ordinance shall become effective and in full force and effect upon the passage of same, for a period of sixty (60) days.

IN RE: MULTILITH - PURCHASE OF

Mr. H. Barner Batte, Clerk of Circuit Court informed the Board that on June 1, 1966 the Board appropriated \$3,500.00 for purchase of Micro-film reader/printer equipment and requested that some of these funds be used to purchase a Multilith machine to be used for reproducing forms, documents, etc. Mr. Meredith moved that said request be authorized. Mr. Winn seconded. Motion carried.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
