

VIRGINIA: AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF
DINWIDDIE COUNTY HELD AT THE AGRICULTURAL BUILDING
OF SAID COUNTY ON THE 15TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1967 AT
8:00 P.M.

IN RE: READING OF MINUTES.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of January, 1967 amounting to \$7,669.93 be allowed and checks numbering 67-92 thru 67-123, both inclusive, be issued therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County and said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: JAIL-APPROVAL OF SCHEME 4 DATED FEBRUARY, 1967

Mr. Gordon B. Galusha, architect for the new proposed jail presented two preliminary schemes numbered 3 and 4. Scheme #4 did not include quarters for the jailer. After discussion concerning comparative cost of construction and operation of a jail without a resident jailer, Mr. Chandler moved that scheme 4 dated February, 1967 be approved. Mr. Winn seconded. Motion was carried and Mr. Galusha was directed to present elevations as soon as practicable.

IN RE: INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

It appearing to the Board that a group of leading citizens of this county had joined together and requested that the Board of Supervisors initiate and approve an Industrial Development Authority as outlined in Chapter 33, Section 15.1-1773 of the Code of Virginia as amended 1966. Mr. W. H. Caldwell, Executive Director, Appomattox Basin Industrial Development Corporation, explained how such an authority would work.

After discussion, Mr. Chandler moved that the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors initiate action to organize an Industrial Development Authority in this county. Mr. Smith seconded. The motion was carried unanimously and the Commonwealth Attorney and the Executive Secretary were directed to prepare said ordinance.

IN RE: EARLY SQUIRREL SEASON

Mr. Winn suggested to the Board that an early squirrel season would be desired by some citizens of this county. Mr. F. M. Fenderson, Game Warden, stated that the Virginia law prohibited an early squirrel season in this county without action by the General Assembly.

Mr. Winn moved that this Board request the Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries and this county's representatives in the General Assembly to introduce legislation during the next session of the General Assembly to approve an open season on squirrels in Dinwiddie County from September 1-15 of each year in addition to the general hunting season. Mr. Chandler seconded. Motion was carried.

IN RE: J. R. JONES - USE PERMIT FOR TRAILER COURT

Mr. J. R. Jones, Route 1, McKenney appeared before the Board and requested a use permit for a six (6) unit trailer court on his land approximately 2 miles south of McKenney on Route 644. The Board was informed that this area is zoned agricultural A-2.

Mr. Chandler moved that a use permit be granted Mr. Jones for a 6 unit trailer court on Route 644 approximately 2 miles south of McKenney subject to compliance with the trailer ordinance and the zoning ordinance. Mr. Winn seconded. Motion carried.

IN RE: COUNTY TAGS FOR NAMOZINE FIRE DEPARTMENT

There was presented a letter from Namozine Vol. Fire Dept. requesting that 35 county tags be issued free to the members of that Dept. as approved June 1, 1966

Mr. Smith moved that one county tag be issued free of charge to each active member of the Namozine Volunteer Fire Dept. residing in Dinwiddie County up to a maximum of 35 tags. Mr. Chandler seconded. Motion was carried.

IN RE: CHOWAN RIVER BASIN-NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

There was read a notice that the State Water Control Board would hold a public hearing March 2, 1967 at Franklin, Virginia to establish standards of quality for the Chowan River Basin (Nottoway Meherrin, and Blackwater Rivers).

It appearing to the Board that the Nottoway River borders this county and that this county is interested in any action concerning such river; the Chairman directed that the Executive Secretary attend said public hearing.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:40 P. M.
