IN RE: READING OF MINUTES.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of August, 1967 amounting to \$9,114.73 be allowed and checks numbering 67-816 thru 67-871, both inclusive be issued therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County and said claims have been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: PATRICK HENRY HOSPITAL FOR THE CHROMICALLY ILL.

Mr. H. Y. Hawthorne, Administrator of Patrick Henry Hospital of which Dinwiddie County is a participating member, gave an interesting presentation about the activities and facilities of the Hospital.

IN RE: RIFLE AND PISTOL TARGET RANGE.

Milton Hargrave, Jr., having been appointed at the Aug. 16th meeting as a member of a committee to investigate a rifle and pistol range near the intersection of Vaughan Road and Flank Road reported that in his opinion the range, if properly supervised, presented very little danger to the public.

IN RE: COUNTY COURT - PURCHASE OF SECRETARY'S CHAIR APPROVED.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Smith and carried the purchase of a secretarial chair for the County Court Clerk was approved.

IN RE: PLAT - WESTERN HILLS SECTION 5 APPROVED.

A plat of Western Hills Section No. 5 having been referred to the Planning Commission at the September 6th meeting and the Board hearing the recommendation by the Commission that the plat be approved as presented;

Therefore upon motion of Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Hauser and carried the final plat of Western Hills Section 5 was approved and ordered signed by the Chairman and the Clerk was directed to record said plat upon presentation and posting of a bond in the amount of \$5,000.00 in lieu of construction of streets.

IN RE: LIVESTOCK CLAIMS.

The Commonwealth's Attorney having been requested at the September 6th meeting to determine if the Board must pay for all claims of livestock damage by unknown or unclaimed dogs reported that in his interpretation of the Code of Virginia the Board must pay a reasonable value for livestock and/or fowl killed by unknown or unclaimed dogs.

IN RE: RADIO - PURCHASE OF FOR GAME WARDEN.

The Executive Secretary reported the radio approved to be purchased for use by the Game Warden had not been ordered because he was unable to obtain the frequency of the private line filtering element from Motorola Corp.

The Commonwealth's Attorney was requested to write Motorola and obtain said frequency.

IN RE: BOAT LANDING.

The Board was notified by the Executive Director that the Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries did not intend to exercise their option to purchase land on Lake Chesdin for a public board ramp as requested to do so by the Board at the August 16th meeting.

After discussion, the Chairman appointed a committee consisting of A. M. Smith, Milton Hargrave and G.M. Watkins and asked that they appear at the next meeting of the Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries to request the Commission to purchase said land for a public access to Lake Chesdin under the Public Access Area Program.

IN RE: FIREARMS ORDINANCE.

Upon motion of Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Chandler and carried the following letter was ordered entered into the records to be considered at the public hearing October 4th.

Gentlemen:

The undersigned, A. Mitchell Smith and F. M. Fenderson, were appointed as a three man committee to make a study of and report on a possible gun ordinance for the County of Dinwiddie. On September 6, 1967, at the last Board meeting, this committee reported its findings to the Board and recommended a gun ordinance to be considered by the Board, which ordinance was ordered to be set up for public hearing on October 4, 1967.

At the request of the committee, and on behalf of the committee, I am writing at this time to advise the Board that the committee, collectively and individually, have had numerous contacts from the citizens of the County and are of the unanimous opinion that their recommended ordinance heretofore submitted should be amended. It is suggested by the committee that the ordinance be amended to limit the distance restraining the discharge of firearms for rifles and pistols to 900 feet and for shot guns to 300 feet and they do respectfully request that the Board of Supervisors effect such amendment.
