IN RE: A. M. SMITH - REELECTED CHAIRMAN 1969

IN RE: MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES FROM THE GENERAL FUND

On motion made and carried, it is ordered by the Board of Supervisors that the accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of December 1968 amounting to \$8,306.04 be allowed and checks numbering 69-1 through 69-43, both inclusive be issued therefore payable out of the General Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARY AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salary of \$391.67 be paid to the Dog Warden for the month of December, 1968 and claims amounting to \$35.75 be paid and checks numbering D-69-1 through D-69-4 be issued, therefore payable out of the Dog Fund of the County.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT

F. E. Jones presented his report as Treasurer for the month of December 1968. Upon examination, motion was made and carried approving said report and endorsing all transfers thereof.

IN RE: EXTENSION SERVICE - ASKS BOARD'S SUPPORT - ELIMINATE JOHNSON GRASS

Mr. J. Ernest Wrenn appeared before the Board and asked the Board to support a program to be conducted by the Extension Service in 1969 to try to locate and eliminate Johnson grass. Johnson grass is considered a destructive weed and is spreading throughout the county.

IN RE: REGISTRAR - ADDITIONAL DAYS - NOT APPROVED

IN RE: COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAXES - CONTINUED



IN RE: YEARLY REPORT - BUILDING INSPECTOR


The yearly report of the Building Inspector was presented to the Board for review. The following permits for the year 1968 were issued:
