IN RE: MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: PAYMENT OF CLAIMS

On motion made and carried it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of June 1969 be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund - checks numbering 69-647 through 69-698 amounting to \$20,943.19. Supply Fund - checks numbering 69-SF-2 & 3 amounting to \$27.69. Jail Fund - checks numbering J-69-8 & 9 in the amount of \$25,160.20.

IN RE: WATER SUPPLY - NEW JAIL

There was discussed possible ways to supply water to the new jail, either with a new well and pump or connect to the present water supply system at the Courthouse.

After discussion the Board directed the Executive Secretary proceed to connect the new jail to the present Courthouse supply. There was also discussed increasing storage capacity of the present Courthouse system and it was resolved to increase storage at a later date if required.

IN RE: DINWIDDIE COUNTY AMBULANCE & RESCUE SQUAD - RADIO, INSURANCE ETC. - APPROVED

Mr. Earl H. Gwaltney and Mr. Ted Baxter representing the Dinwiddie County Ambulance and Rescue Squad briefed the Board on the operation of the rescue squad during the first month of operation and requested the Board of Supervisors purchase a radio, gas, oil and insurance for a second vehicle if purchased by the volunteer organization. The representatives stated they have almost accumulated the amount necessary to purchase the vehicle.

Mr. Hargrave moved, Mr. Winn seconded and it was unanimously carried authorizing the purchase of the radio and that the same benefits be provided to the second vehicle as to the first.

IN RE: DOG WARDEN VEHICLE BIDS - NOT AWARDED

There was received 2 proposals to furnish $\frac{1}{2}$ ton pickup truck to be used by the Dog Warden in enforcement of dog laws. The bids were received from Woody's Chevrolet and Master Chevrolet. The Board discussed the purchase of a vehicle for the Dog Warden and a revision of the policies and procedures to be followed by the Dog Warden.

The Chairman directed that Mr. Winn, Mr. Watkins, Mr. A. Terrell Baskerville and Mr. A. W. Chappell be appointed as a committee to draw up a plan of operation for the Dog Warden. Mr. Hargrave moved, Mr. Winn seconded and it was unanimously carried directing that the purchase of a vehicle be considered after a recommendation by the committee and a vehicle not be purchased at the present time.

IN RE: ASSESSMENT OF TIMBER LANDS

Mr. Tunstall stated the assessment and taxes of certain timber lands appeared to be less after the reassessment of 1966 than before the reassessment. A list of 10 parcels of land selected at random representing 1,861 acres showed the amount of taxes decreased from \$1,029.00 to \$714.00 after the reassessment. Mr. Watkins stated the assessment figures were taken from books of the timber companies and represented the companies evaluation of the property.


There was much discussion concerning the assessment within the County and the Chairman appointed Mr. Tunstall, Mr. Hargrave, Mr. Paul Myers and Mr. A. T. Baskerville as a committee to survey 100 parcels of land, compare same and report back.

IN RE: BOAT LANDING - USE PERMIT - APPROVED

There was presented an application by the Commission of Game & Inland Fisheries for a use permit to operate a public boat landing on Lake Chesdin pursuant to Section 3A-1-13 of the Dinwiddie County Zoning Ordinance. The application was reviewed and approved subject to the conditions adopted February 5, 1969.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 10:23 P.M.
