IN RE: MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: PAYMENT OF CLAIMS

On motion made and carried it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of September 1969 be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund - Checks numbering 69-1056 through 69-1130 amounting to \$20,965.43. Jail Fund - Check number J-69-12 amounting to \$26,460.56.

IN RE: J. A. OZMAR

Mr. J. A. Ozmar appeared before the Board concerning the trailer court permit issued to Mr. Elwyn P. Wilkinson on October 1, for construction of a trailer court adjacent to US 1. Mr. Ozmar requested the County construct a fence between his property and the trailer court to prevent children from entering his property and being susceptible to injury. The Board of Supervisors' obligations concerning this subject were discussed with Mr. Ozmar and informed him they would assist in the future if able to do so.

IN RE: TREATMENT - EXTERMINATING SCHOOL BOARD BUILDING

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Tunstall and carried the Board directed the School Board office building be exterminated after competitive bids are obtained for the service.

IN RE: RABIES CLINIC

The Board was informed the Health Department had set up rabies clinics at Rohoic Elementary School and the Dinwiddie Health Department October 23rd and 31st respectively.

Mr. Winn moved, Mr. Tunstall seconded and after unanimous approval the Board directed the executive secretary request the Health Department to operate a rabies vaccination clinic at McKenney.

IN RE: TREE REMOVAL

Judge B. Hunter Barrow suggested the trees behind the courthouse be removed and the area used for additional parking. He cited the trees are dying and presents a hazzard to the buildings. The Board directed the executive secretary to obtain a recommendation from the Extension Service and receive the feeling of the citizens concerning removal of the trees.

IN RE- INTER-CITY RADIO NETWORK

Sheriff A. Hill Burton informed the Board this County would be eligible for \$1,020.00 in Federal Funds if supplemented by \$680.00 of local funds to provide an inter-city police radio network to join Dinwiddie with nearby cities and counties for instant radio communications. The federal funds being provided under the Federal Omnibus Safe Streets Act.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave seconded by Mr. Winn and carried, the Board appropriated the \$680.00 necessary to join the network.

IN RE: DEER

Mr. Griffin of Ford, Virginia stated deer are destroying his crops and requested assistance from the Board. The Board informed Mr. Griffin the Commission of Game & Inland Fisheries had been requested to open 5 days of general hunting season to permit the taking of doe deer to help reduce the deer population. Such request being denied by the Commission of Game & Inland Fisheries.

No action was taken.

IN RE: TAX EXEMPTION - MUNICIPAL BONDS

There was read a letter from Senator William B. Spong, Jr. in reference to the resolution passed June 4, 1969 requesting all congressional representatives to defeat the tax reform proposal to eliminate the tax exemption features on interest of municipal and local bonds. Mr. Spong stated the Senate Finance Committee had voted to retain the exemption and if the issue comes to the Senate floor he would vote to keep the exemption.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:20 P.M.
