IN RE: MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved without being read.

IN RE: PAYMENT OF CLAIMS

Upon motion duly made and carried it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of April 1970 be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund - Checks numbering 70-439 through 70-509 amounting to \$22,813.76. Jail Fund - Check J-70-6 amounting to \$3,960.00. Library Fund - Checks numbering L-70-3 & 4 amounting to \$56.35.

IN RE: COOL SPRINGS SECTION 4 - R. G. MARTZ DEVELOPER

Mr. R. G. Martz appeared before the Board as requested by the Board at its May 6, 1970 meeting. Mr. Martz explained that Section 4 of Cool Springs Subdivision was in the process of being brought up to state highway standards and this section would be accepted in the very near future. He stated that the roads had gotten in bad shape due to the bad weather and also some of the contractors had not taken care of the roads and lots as they should.

The Board directed Mr. Martz to have the roads ready for the State Highway Department in the very near future.

Mr. Martz was informed that the Board had received numerous complaints concerning Cool Springs streets and hoped these steps would relieve the situation.

IN RE: NEW JAIL DRIVE WAY

Mr. Hargrave explained to the Board that a strip of land between Route 619 and the Courthouse property where the jail is located belongs to him. The County needs this land very badly and he is very much interested in either selling or trading this property to the County. He offered 2 proposals. 1. To swap this land to the County for an equal amount of land. 2. Sell the land to the County at the rate per foot as the County sold land to the Bank of Virginia at Dinwiddie.

The Board instructed the Executive Secretary to contact Circuit Court Judge, D. Carleton Mayes, on the possibility of trading Mr. Hargrave an equal amount of land for his land. The Board agreed to the change in the driveway to the new jail as proposed by the architect, Mr. Gordon B. Galusha.

IN RE: REQUEST TRANSFER OF FUNDS - MR. GEORGE M. HODGE

Mr. George M Hodge, Superintendent of Schools appeared before the Board requesting permission to transfer monies from one category to another within his budget. Mr. Hodge stated he would advise the Board of the categories involved. He also stated the school system will be getting an additional \$31,000.00 from the state.

Upon motion of Mr. Watkins, seconded by Mr. Tunstall and unanimously carried Mr. Hodge was granted permission to make the transfers.

IN RE: PURCHASE OF LAWN MOWER - APPROVED

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave seconded by Mr. Tunstall and unanimously carried the Board authorized the secretary to purchase a push lawn-mower. The Secretary was instructed to use his judgement in buying the best mower possible.

IN RE: AMERICAN OIL COMPANY SIGN -- APPROVAL TABLED

The American Oil Company requests permission to place a sign on the property at the intersection of 460 & I-85.

This request was tabled until the next meeting so this matter could be discussed with Mr. Arlie Andrews, Mayor of Petersburg, Virginia.

IN RE: RESCUE SQUAD CELEBRATING 1ST ANNIVERSARY



IN RE MARKERS AT LAKE CHESDIN REQUESTED AND APPROVED

Upon motion of Mr. Tunstall, seconded by Mr. Winn and carried the Board approved the installation of wave markers for boat marinas on Lake Chesdin. In addition, the Executive Secretary was instructed to ask the State Game & Inland Fisheries the status of the State's marina for Dinwiddie County.
