IN RE: MINUTES

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn and unanimously carried the minutes of the previous meeting were approved without being read.

IN RE: PAYMENT OF CLAIMS - SALARIES

Upon motion duly made and carried it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of November 1970 be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund - Checks numbering 70-1233 through 70-1277 amounting to \$9,754.93. Dog Fund - Checks numbering D-70-76 through D-70-84 amounting to \$699.41.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT

F. E. Jones, Treasurer presented his report for the month of November 1970. Upon examination, motion was made and carried approving said report and endorsing all transfers thereof.

IN RE: WELFARE DEPARTMENT

Mrs. King B. Talley presented 3 Health Department referrals for State Local Hospitalization for sterilization operations.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, these three requests were unanimously approved.

IN RE: HEALTH DEPARTMENT - APPROVAL OF PART-TIME SANITATION OFFICER

Dr. J. G. McNiel appeared before the Board to request that the County hire for two days per week a sanitarian to help Mr. Kenton Chestnut. He stated that the cost would be approximately \$1,000.00 from now until June 30, 1970.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, the Board unanimously approved the part-time sanitarian as requested by Dr. McNiel.

IN RE: MONTHLY REPORT - BUILDING INSPECTOR

Mr. James L. Blaha, Building Inspector, presented his report for the month of November 1970. He commented that the increased work load on Mr. Chestnut could possibly be due to the increase in building activity.

IN RE: SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT - T. W. NEWSOM - REQUEST PERMISSION TO TAKE OPTION ON 20 ACRE SITE FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Mr. T. W. Newsom, Superintendent of Schools, requested permission to take an option on 20 acres of land for the purpose of building a new elementary school. This land being approximately 5 miles north of Dinwiddie Courthouse on US Route 1.

Mr. Winn asked about locating a school in Darvills District as the people in that area do not have a school near them. Mr. Newsom stated that the new elementary school would replace Southside Elementary School which would be converted into an annex of the Dinwiddie County Junior High School.

The approximate price of the property to be \$20,000.00.

Mr. Hargrave moved, Mr. Winn seconded and it was unanimously carried, that the Superintendent and the School Board begin with the acquisition of the 20 acres based on the price of approximately \$20,000.00. Mr. Newsom stated that he would have the Commonwealth's Attorney draw up a contract with the stipulation the school board would purchase the land providing proper sewerage facilities could be located on the land.

IN RE: ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION - A. W. CHAPPELL

Mr. A. W. Chappell presented his monthly report and a claim for Mr. Bernard E. Morgan, Jr., for 10 pigs, 1 sow, and 1 boar.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, the Board unanimously agreed to pay Mr. Morgan \$150.00 for his claim.

IN RE: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Mr. R. V. Lancaster, III, District Resident Engineer, Highway Department asked the supervisors if they had any questions.

Mr. Winn stated he had asked Mr. B. C. Medlock to put signs up indicating the boundaries of Darvills but this had not been done. He asked that these be put up before Christmas if possible. Mr. Lancaster stated this matter would be taken care of.

IN RE: REQUEST FOR HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WORKERS TO RETURN DOG COLLARS

Mr. A. W. Chappell, Dog Warden, asked Mr. Lancaster to instruct his people that when a dog is buried by the Highway Department that has been killed on the highway that the collar of the dog be turned in at the office of the executive secretary at Dinwiddie or the owner of the dog notified.

Mr. Lancaster stated that this was the policy of the Highway Department and he would see to it that it is enforced.

IN RE: RAMBLEWOOD SUBDIVISION - SECTION 3

Mr. George Bogese appeared before the Board and presented a plat of Section 3, Ramblewood Subdivision for approval. Mr. Bogese was instructed to wait until after the public hearing on Cul-De-Sacs at 4:00 P.M.

IN RE: BOARD INFORMED OF CHANGES IN ROUTING OF ROUTE 460 NEAR FORD

Mr. L. R. Treat Jr., Resident Engineer, Mr. James Yates, and Albert Uzell, with the Department of Highways presented plans on the routing of 460 in the Ford area. The original plan would have displaced 9 families and the present plans will displace only 3.

The Board appreciated the highway officials informing them of these changes and indicated approval of the new route.

IN RE: AUDIT BY V. LEE PARKER AND COMPANY FOR YEAR ENDING JUNE 30 1971

V. Lee Parker and Company submitted a written proposal to audit the County books and records for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971 in conformity with the Auditor of the Public Accounts for \$1,250.00 furnishing the usual number of copies.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Hargrave and unanimously carried V. Lee Parker and Company was given the contract to conduct the audit for the year 1970-71.

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IN RE: PAYROLL CHECKS FOR MONTH OF DECMEBER - AUTHORIZED FOR DECEMBER 23RD

Upon motion of Mr. Tunstall, seconded by Mr. Winn, the Chairman, Executive Secretary and Treasurer were authorized to sign the December payroll checks. The same to be delivered to the employees on December 23, 1970.

IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING - SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE SECTION 15-60 - AMENDED

This being the time and place as advertised in the Progress Index to hold a public hearing on a change in Section 15-60 of the Subdivision Ordinance.

Mr. Tom Elmore, and Mr. Neal Barnes appeared in behalf of the Home Builder's Association. They suggested that the limit of 400 feet in length on Cul-De-Sacs be raised or the length of the Cul-De-Sacs be unlimited.

No one appeared on behalf of the present ordinance.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn and unanimously carried Section 15-60 of the Subdivision Ordinance is changed to read as follows:

"Minor terminal streets (cul-de-sacs) designed to have one end permanently closed shall be terminated by a turnaround of not less than one hundred feet in diameter."

IN RE: RAMBLEWOOD SUBDIVISION - SECTION 3 - APPROVED

Mr. George Bogese reappeared before the Board and presented his plat of Section 3 in Ramblewood Subdivision.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, the Board unanimously authorized Mr. Smith to sign said plat after the Highway & Health Department's had signed.

IN RE: ASHLEY SUBDIVISION - APPROVED PLAT

Mr. Arthur Harroway presented to the Board a plat of Ashley Subdivision. The plat has been signed by the Highway and Health Departments.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Watkins, the Chairman was unanimously authorized to sign the Ashley Subdivision Plat.

IN RE: EDWARD H. CANTRELL - M. A. TALLEY REQUEST TO BECOME LICENSE AGENT FOR COMMISSION

Mr. S. E. Winn presented a request from Mr. E. H. Cantrell and Mr. Meade A. Talley to become license agent's for the Commission of Game & Inland Fisheries.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Hargrave, the Board authorized the Executive Secretary to assist Mr. Cantrell in becoming a license agent. Also Mr. Meade A. Talley in becoming a license agent for the Commission.

IN RE: COUNTY EXPENSES - I-85 REPORTED

The Board was informed by the Executive Secretary that the total bill for the opening ceremonies of I-85 for the County of Dinwiddie was \$28.12.
