

VIRGINIA: AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF DINWIDDIE COUNTY HELD AT THE AGRICULTURAL BUILDING OF SAID COUNTY ON THE 6TH DAY OF JANUARY 1971 AT 2:00 P.M.

IN RE: ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN YEAR 1971

Mr. A. Mitchell Smith opened the meeting by turning the chair over to the Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary called for nominations for the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the year 1971. Mr. Tunstall nominated Mr. A. M. Smith, Mr. Winn seconded. Mr. Winn moved, Mr. Tunstall seconded that nominations be closed. Mr. Smith was unanimously re-elected Chairman of the Board.

IN RE: ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN YEAR 1971

Mr. Smith resumed the chair and called for nominations for Vice-Chairman for the year 1971. Mr. Winn nominated Mr. T. H. Tunstall. Mr. Watkins nominated Mr. S. E. Winn. This nomination was seconded by Mr. Tunstall. Mr. Winn was unanimously re-elected Vice Chairman for the year 1971.

IN RE: MINUTES

Upon motion duly made and carried the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: PAYMENT OF CLAIMS

Upon motion duly made and carried it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of December 1970 be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund - Checks numbering 71-1 through 71-5 amounting to \$13,269.10.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT

F. E. Jones, Treasurer presented his report for the month of December 1970. Upon examination, motion was made and carried approving said report and endorsing all transfers thereof.

IN RE: SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT

Mr. T. W. Newsom, Superintendent of Schools stated that Federal money applied for several months ago would be forthcoming very shortly.

IN RE: BUILDING INSPECTOR - MONTHLY REPORT

Mr. James L. Blaha, Building Inspector, presented his monthly report and filed the following record: Total Dwellings - 142; Total value - \$4,078,955.00 and Total fees collected - \$9,718.34. The figures stated above are for the complete year 1970. The supervisors were quite surprised that the building fees reached \$1,000.00 for the month of December.

IN RE: DOG WARDEN - PRESENTS CLAIMS

Mr. A. W. Chappell, Dog Warden presented his monthly report and filed the following claims:

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn and unanimously carried Mr. C. E. Goolsby was paid \$70.00 for 10 goats.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, the Board unanimously agreed to pay Mr. J. E. Williams \$21.00 for 3 old goats and \$6.00 for 2 young goats.

IN RE: SUPERINTENDENT OF WELFARE

Mrs. King B. Talley presented requests for 2 sterilizations. Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Watkins, the Board unanimously approved these request.

IN RE: APPOMATTOX RIVER WATER AUTHORITY BILL

Upon motion of Mr. Tunstall, seconded by Mr. Hargrave, the Chairman, Executive Secretary and the Treasurer are directed to sign the check to pay the bill for the Appomattox River Water Authority upon receipt of the bill each quarter.

IN RE: BOAT RAMP - LAKE CHESDIN

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn and unanimously carried the Board directed the Executive Secretary to begin again the policing of the boat ramp area at the Brasfield Dam.

IN RE: ACCEPTANCE OF JAIL - RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, this Board on December 30, 1970, met with officials of Kenbridge Construction Company, Gordon B. Galusha, Architect and certain contractors, relative to inspection and possible acceptance of the completed Dinwiddie County jail facility; and

WHEREAS, the concensus of opinion of this Board that the jail was properly completed with exception of some very minor corrections and further that same should be accepted by Dinwiddie County on December 30, 1970.

NOW THEREFORE, on motion duly made by Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn and unanimously carried, be it resolved that this Board on behalf of Dinwiddie County does hereby accept the Dinwiddie County jail facility from Kenbridge Construction Company and Gordon B. Galusha, Architect, with the qualification that certain minor corrections be effected.

IN RE: J. E. WILLIAMS

Mr. J. E. Williams appeared before the Board to tell them about threats on life and property to local people from hunters from out of the area.

Mr. Williams was advised by the Board to seek the assistance of the sheriff and the game warden.

IN RE: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Mr. R. V. Lancaster, III and Mr. B. C. Medlock, representatives of the Highway Department appeared before the Board to answer any questions the Board might have.

DARVILLS DISTRICT Mr. S. E. Winn asked that the bridge on Route 612 (Harper's Bridge) be completed as soon as possible as it was causing a great inconvenience to area residents. Mr. Lancaster stated that he would do all possible to hurry the completion of the bridge but gave no specific date.

Mr. Winn thanked Mr. Lancaster and Mr. Medlock for the work at the Intersection of Route 613 and Route 40 and the new Darvills signs.

ROWANTY DISTRICT Mr. M. I. Hargrave, Jr. asked that a road count be taken on Route 734 at each end rather than have the count taken in the middle. He requested that something be done to this road as it is very muddy and very difficult to travel on.

ROHOIC DISTRICT Mr. A. Mitchell Smith asked if there were any plans for improvements at the Intersection of Route 1 & 226 since the erection of the new Esso Station. Mr. Lancaster stated that no plans were on the drawing Board but a close look would be taken at this intersection.

IN RE: DINWIDDIE COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Tunstall the Board unanimously approved the contract with American Oil Company to rent the service station at the intersection of Route 1 and 703 for a fire house. This motion was unanimously carried.

IN RE: REQUEST FOR TELEPHONE AND RADIOS

Mr. Billy Hodges appeared before the Board to ask for radios for the two fire trucks at Dinwiddie and that a telephone be installed in the newly rented building.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, the Board unanimously directed the Executive Secretary to install the telephones and to check on the price of radios for the two fire vehicles.

IN RE: MUD & SNOW GRIP TIRES ON FIRE TRUCK

Upon motion of Mr. Tunstall, seconded by Mr. Hargrave, the Board unanimously approve the purchasing of mud and snow tires for the new Dinwiddie fire engine.

IN RE: PART-TIME SANITATION OFFICER - SALARY

The Board was advised by Mr. Knott that the cost of the part-time sanitarian would be \$396.90 from January 1, 1971 through June 30, 1971.

IN RE: TOWN OF MCKENNEY - LICENSE TAGS

The Executive Secretary informed the Board that the Town of McKenney had at its Council meeting December 9, 1970 voted to retain all the automobile license fees for the town.

IN RE: COURTHOUSE REMODELING COMMITTEE

Mr. Watkins asked Mr. Hargrave, chairman of the courthouse committee, the status of the committee. Mr. Hargrave advised the Board that he was going to set a meeting date in the very near future to discuss with Judge D. C. Mayes the courtroom needs.

IN RE: DISCUSSION OF TRASH REMOVAL

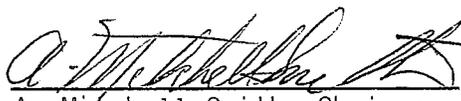
