IN RE: MINUTES

The minutes of the August 4th meeting were approved without being read.

IN RE: CLAIMS - SALARY PAYMENTS

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, all 5 members voting aye, it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of August 1971 be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund Checks numbering 71-973 through 71-1085 amounting to \$19,779.44. Dog Fund- Checks numbering D-71-56 through D-71-61 amounting to \$643.33.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT

F. E. Jones, Treasurer, presented his report for the month of July 1971. Upon examination, motion was made and carried approving said report and endorsing all transfers thereof.

IN RE: BUILDING INSPECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. James L. Blaha presented his monthly report as building inspector.

IN RE: SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Mr. T. W. Newsoms informed the Board that school opened on September 7th and everything was running smoothly.

IN RE: APPROPRIATION OF WORK STUDY FUNDS

Mr. T. W. Newsom requested that the Board appropriate up to \$2,000.00 for the work study plan for the school year 1971-72. This involves students working 1 to 3 hours a day either at school or in county offices. The state pays 80% and the County 20% for their services. The student gets \$1.00 per hour.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, all five members voting "aye" the Board approved the work study plan for the year 1971-72.

IN RE: HOSPITAL CONTRACT - PETERSBURG GENERAL HOSPITAL

Mrs. King B. Talley, Superintendent of Welfare, appeared before the Board and presented an S.L.H. contract with Petersburg General Hospital for \$49.68 per day for the fiscal year 1971-72.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, all five members voting "aye", the Board approved this contract.

IN RE: SLH APPLICATION

Mrs. King B. Talley presented 3 applications for state and local hospitalization.

Upon motion of Mr. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, all five members voting "aye" the applications for Dixie Robertson and Patricia Ann Morgan were approved. The application for Tarreyton Walker was disapproved.

IN RE: ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION - CLAIMS

Mr. A. W. Chappell presented his report for the month of August along with 4 claims.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, all 5 members voting "aye", the following claims were approved.

Frank Vinsh - one sheep - \$20.00; W. L. Gooch - 30 hens - \$30.00; James E. Williams (2 claims) - 2 nanny goats - \$14.00 and 2 billy goats - \$8.00.

IN RE: JAMES E. WALTERS - FEDERAL HOME ADMINISTRATION

Mr. J. E. Walters appeared before the Board to explain the part the Federal Home Administration plays in the financing of home and farms in Dinwiddie County.

IN RE: DR. J. G. McNIEL

Dr. J. G. McNiel appeared before the Board to tell them that the second full time sanitarian, Mr. Howard R. Robertson, Jr. was on the job and he wished to thank the Board again for their assistance.

IN RE: AGRICULTURAL A-3 - PUBLIC HEARING

This being the time and place as advertised in the Progress-Index, August 25th and September 1st, to hold a public hearing to consider amending the Agricultural A-3 Zoning Ordinance.

Several people appeared in favor of amending the ordinance. No one appeared in opposition.

Upon motion of Mr. Watkins, seconded by Mr. Winn, all 5 members voting "aye", the Agricultural A-3 Zoning Ordinance was amended to allow mobile homes with the following restrictions:

1. Not less than 45 feet in length
2. Must be on permanent foundations
3. Located on not less than two (2) acres of land

IN RE: HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Mr. R. V. Lancaster, III and Mr. B. C. Medlock, representing the Highway Department, appeared before the Board and presented the 1971-72 Secondary System Construction Budget with the request that this budget be approved as soon as possible. In addition, he presented to the Board the Operational and Fiscal Summary for Dinwiddie County covering the fiscal year 1970-71.

IN RE: RESOLUTION

Upon motion of M. Hargrave, seconded by Mr. Winn, all 5 members voting "aye" the following resolution was presented.

It appearing to the Board that the speed limit of 55 miles per hour on Route 703, Vaughan Road from the Seaboard Coastline Railroad to U.S. Route 1, a very congested area, is excessive, and

It appearing to the Board that because of this excessive speed limit, people and property are being endangered

Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County request the State Highway Department to reduce the speed limit from 55 miles per hour to 35 miles from the Seaboard Coastline Railroad to U.S. Route 1 on Route 703.

IN RE: APPOINTMENT OF WELFARE BOARD MEMBER - DEFERRED

The Board deferred action on the appointment of a member to the Welfare Board until a later date.

IN RE: BOARD OF ASSESSORS - DEFERRED

The Board deferred until a later date the appointment of members to the Board of Assessors.

IN RE: PURCHASE OF LAND CARDS - AUTHORIZED

Mr. R. W. Bridgman, Commissioner of the Revenue appeared before the Board and requested that he be authorized to purchase approximately 10,000 land cards.

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, all five members voting "aye", the Board approved Mr. Bridgman's request.

IN RE: STREET LIGHT

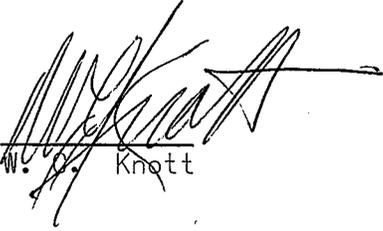

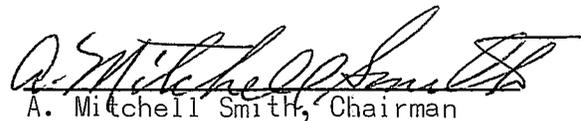
IN RE: PURCHASE OF LAND MAPS APPROVED
