IN RE: MINUTES

Upon motion of Mr. Rundle, seconded by Mr. Crowder, Mr. Rundle, Mr. Crowder, Mr. Winn and Mr. Hargrave voting "aye", Mr. Tunstall had not arrived, the minutes of the April 5th meeting were approved without being read.

IN RE: PAYMENT OF CLAIMS

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Crowder, Mr. Winn, Mr. Crowder, Mr. Hargrave and Mr. Rundle voting "aye", Mr. Tunstall had not arrived, it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the following funds for the month of March 1972, be issued payable out of the respective accounts. General Fund - Checks numbering 72-459 through 72-550 amounting to \$46,628.45.

IN RE: CHARLES CROWDER

Mr. Charles Crowder, a local contractor, appeared before the Board to request the following: There be provided for citizens of Northern Dinwiddie, recreational facilities and a landfill. Mr. Crowder stated that the people would construct and maintain the facilities if the County provided the land for such facility.

The Board was in agreement with Mr. Crowder that recreational facilities were needed in this area. The landfill to be operated by the City of Petersburg, located on the VEPCO Canal, would be opened no later than June 1st of this year. This should solve this problem for the citizens of this area. Mr. T. W. Newsom, Superintendent of Schools, suggested that the fields at the Eastside, Rohoic and Midway Elementary schools could be improved so that these people might use them. Mr. Rundle suggested that Mr. Crowder and his group come up with a list of 10 to 15 people from which the Chairman of the Board appoint a committee along with representatives from the Board and other interested people to assist in solving the recreational problem in Northern Dinwiddie. Mr. Crowder agreed to this and stated he would get names in as soon as possible.

IN RE: DINWIDDIE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Upon motion of Mr. Winn, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, Mr. Winn, Mr. Tunstall, Mr. Rundle, Mr. Crowder and Mr. Hargrave voting "aye", for the year 1972 only, a maintenance check on the pump for the new fire truck at a cost of \$100.00, was approved.

Upon motion of Mr. Tunstall, seconded by Mr. Winn, all five members voting "aye", the Dinwiddie Fire Department was authorized to repair the front end pump on the old fire truck, cost not to exceed \$100.00. Those voting "aye" were Mr. Tunstall, Mr. Winn, Mr. Rundle, Mr. Crowder and Mr. Hargrave.

Upon motion of Mr. Rundle, seconded by Mr. Tunstall, all members voting "aye", the Board agreed to reimburse the fire department \$75.00 for the plans of their proposed new fire building. Those voting "aye" being: Mr. Rundle, Mr. Tunstall; Mr. Winn; Mr. Crowder and Mr. Hargrave.

IN RE: APPOINTMENT OF ROADVIEWERS 1972

Upon motion of Mr. Tunstall, seconded by Mr. Winn, all five members voting "aye", the following persons were appointed to serve as roadviewers for the year 1972: Mr. C. E. Thweatt; Mr. M. E. Bass; Mr. W. A. Prosise; Mr. William Green; Mr. C. Y. Avery, Jr.

IN RE: FORD FIRE DEPARTMENT


Mr. Bobby Christopher, Chief, Ford Volunteer Fire Department requested the Board purchase a radio for their truck.
