IN RE: MINUTES

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye", the minutes of the March 3rd, 1976 meeting were approved as presented.

IN RE: CLAIMS

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Clay, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the claims against the following funds were approved:

General fund - checks 76-441 through 76-546 amounting to \$22,342.49; Circuit Court - checks CC-76-22 through CC-76-36 amounting to \$226.56; Library fund - checks LF-76-3 and LF-76-4 amounting to \$62.00; Revenue Sharing - checks RS-76-7A and RS-76-7 amounting to \$15,509.00.

IN RE: REZONING APPLICATION - P-76-2 - DAVID J. ROANE

This being the time and place as advertised in the Progress-Index on March 3rd and March 10th for the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors to conduct a public hearing on the rezoning application P-76-2 of David J. Roane, to change the district classification from "Agricultural A-2" to "Industrial M-1" of a certain tract of land containing 10.1 acres, more or less, shown as Parcel 35 of Section 20 of the Zoning Map of Dinwiddie County.

The Chairman reviewed the Planning Commission minutes wherein they recommended that Mr. Roane change his request from Industrial M-1 to Business B-2 and that the present Zoning Ordinance be amended such that a cabinet, furniture and upholstery shop would be permitted within the business B-2 district.

The Planning Commission on March 16, 1976, conducted a public hearing on this amendment to the Zoning Ordinance adding cabinet, furniture and upholstery shops to Business B-2 and recommended that the Board adopt such an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance.

The County Administrator stated that after a thorough study of the Business B-2 classification, and the Industrial M-1 classification, he had difficulty concurring with the addition of cabinet, furniture and upholstery shops to Business B-2.

Back in July of 1975 the Board of Supervisors rejected a request for a B-2 classification on a parcel of land adjacent to the Sutherland Manor Supermarket land and located one and one-half miles from Mr. Roane's property.

Mr. David J. Roane appeared in support of his request stating that he would like to change it from Industrial M-1 to Business B-2 provided the Zoning Ordinance was amended to allow a cabinet, furniture and upholstery shop within a Business B-2 district.

Mr. Gilbert Marek and Mr. W. R. Phillips, adjacent landowners, appeared to oppose the Industrial M-1 request; however, both were in support of the B-2 classification with the Zoning Ordinance amended to allow a cabinet, furniture and upholstery shop.

Upon motion of Mr. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Clay, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, as adopted April 1, 1970, and as heretofore amended, be further amended by changing the district classification of Parcel 35, Section 20 of the Zoning Map from "Agricultural A-2" to "Business B-2" and in all other respects, said Zoning Ordinance is hereby reordained.

The County Administrator advised the Board that the amendment to the Business B-2 classification to allow cabinet, furniture and upholstery shops would be before the Board at the April 21st meeting.

IN RE: REZONING APPLICATION - P-76-1 - WILLIAM M. REESE

This being the time and place as advertised in the Progress-Index on March 3rd and March 10th for the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors to conduct a public hearing on the rezoning application P-76-1 of William M. Reese to change the district classification from "Residential R-1" to "Business B-2" of a certain tract of land containing 0.998 acres, more or less, shown as Parcel 3-6-A of Section 57A of the Zoning Map of Dinwiddie County.

The Chairman reviewed the Planning Commission minutes wherein they recommended approval of the request.

Mr. William M. Reese appeared in support of his request stating that the site under question has operated as a business since 1926 and it appeared that this was compatible with the neighborhood.

No one appeared in opposition.

Upon motion of Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Clay, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the Dinwiddie County Code, as adopted April 1, 1970, and as heretofore amended, be further amended by changing the district classification of Parcel 3-6-A, Section 57A of the Zoning Map from "Residential R-1" to "Business B-2", and in all other respects, said Zoning Ordinance is hereby reordained.

IN RE: NAMOZINE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT - PURCHASE OF NEW FIRE TRUCK

Mr. Fletcher L. Mayton, Chief, of the Namozine Volunteer Fire Department, appeared before the Board to present the following bids for their consideration:

John Bean - Volume 750 Gallon Per Minute, Class "A" Pumper mounted on a Ford F-755 chassis ---	\$34,230.00
American Fire Equipment Company - Volume 750 Gallon Per Minute Class "A" Pumper mounted on a Ford F-755 chassis	\$38,540.00
Richmond Rubber Co. - Volume 750 Gallon Per Minute, Class "A" Pumper mounted on a Ford F-755 chassis	\$44,387.00

The Namozine Volunteer Fire Department requested a new fire truck last year but, due to the fact that Dinwiddie and Ford had a greater need, they deferred their request until this year. At last year's budget discussions, the Supervisors indicated they would act favorably upon a new fire truck for the Namozine Volunteer Fire Department.

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the County Administrator is hereby authorized to purchase one John Bean - Volume 750 Gallon Per Minute, Class "A" Pumper mounted on a Ford F-755 chassis from Jack L. Slagle Fire Equipment and Supply Co., Inc. at a cost of \$34,230.00.

IN RE: SALE OF OLD NAMOZINE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT TRUCK

Mr. Fletcher Mayton stated that the Jack L. Slagle Fire Equipment and Supply Company, Inc. had offered \$6,000 for the Namozine Volunteer Fire Department's old fire truck and he recommended that the Board accept this offer. The old fire truck was not being used by the fire department because the brakes could not be repaired.

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the County Administrator and the Commonwealth's Attorney are hereby authorized to petition the Circuit Court for permission to sell the Namozine Volunteer Fire Department's old fire truck for \$6,000 to Jack L. Slagle Fire Equipment and Supply Co., Inc.

IN RE: ROUTE 610 AND BRIDGE AT BASKERVILLE'S MILL

Dr. Randolph Atkinson, representing the land owners along Route 610 in the area of Baskerville's Mill, appeared before the Board to express concern over the proposed improvements on Route 610 and the construction of a new bridge over the Nottoway River at Baskerville's Mill.

After Dr. Atkinson's presentation, the Chairman read the resolution passed by the Board of Supervisors at the March 3rd meeting concerning Route 610 improvements and the bridge to be constructed over the Nottoway River at Baskerville's Mill. Mr. Hargrave suggested that Dr. Atkinson review this resolution with the others concerned. If this resolution was not what they wanted, then the Board would consider additional action. Mr. R. V. Lancaster, III, Resident Engineer of the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation, also discussed the matter with Dr. Atkinson and his group.

Dr. Atkinson returned in a few minutes and stated that the resolution was exactly what his group wanted and he thanked the Board of Supervisors for their action and for the opportunity to appear and express his groups views and wishes.

IN RE: DINWIDDIE SPCA - USE OF A PORTION OF THE NEW DOG POUND

Mr. Kerry Gianotti, representing the Dinwiddie County SPCA, appeared before the Board to request their approval of the use of one of the dog runs in the new County Dog Pound. The SPCA would not bring dogs into the dog pound but would use this run only for those dogs picked up by the Dog Warden that the SPCA felt would make good pets. When the dog had stayed the required number of days in the dog pound rather than put the dog to sleep, the Dog Warden would put the dog into the SPCA run. At that time the SPCA accepts sole responsibility for the dog.

Gene T. Hughes, Dinwiddie Dog Warden, stated that the use of the run would not present any problems for his operation and recommended that the Board authorize the use of one run in the new dog pound by the SPCA.

Upon motion of Mr. Leftwich, seconded by Mr. Bennett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Clay, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the Dinwiddie County SPCA is hereby authorized to use one run in the new County dog pound until such time as they are notified by the County Administrator that this agreement is terminated, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that only those dogs picked up by the Dog Warden and transferred to the SPCA's run for placement are to be housed in this run, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that the Dinwiddie County SPCA assumes full responsibility for all dogs transferred by the Dog Warden to the SPCA's run.

IN RE: APPROVAL OF STUDY OF APPOMATTOX RIVER

Mr. Tom Miller, President of Float Fishermen of Virginia, and Professor Edward Cox of Virginia State College, representing the Scenic Appomattox River Committee, gave a brief presentation of the Appomattox River area to be studied for Scenic River designation and requested the Board's approval of a resolution formally endorsing the study.

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that they hereby endorse a study of the six mile section of the Appomattox River, from Lake Chesdin to Campbell's Bridge in Petersburg for designation as a scenic river in the Virginia Scenic Rivers Program.

IN RE: APPOINTMENT - SCENIC APPOMATTOX RIVER COMMITTEE ADVISORY GROUP

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye",

BE IT RESOLVED BY the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that Mr. W. C. Scheid, Director of Planning, is hereby appointed to serve on the Scenic Appomattox River Committee Advisory Group.

IN RE: CRATER PLANNING DISTRICT COMMISSION BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Upon motion of Mr. Hodnett, seconded by Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye", Mr. Charles R. Titmus is hereby appointed to the Crater Planning District Commission Board of Directors, term to expire December 31, 1979.

IN RE: REPLACEMENT OF RETIRING CORRECTIONAL OFFICER

Upon motion of Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Clay, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye", the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, Sheriff, Charles L. Mitchell, advised the Board that Correctional Officer P. S. Cleaton is retiring as of April 1, 1976; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mitchell advised the Board that in accordance with Compensation Board Directive, dated August 25, 1975, a resolution from the Board of Supervisors concurring with the Constitutional Officer's request to hire new personnel, must be filed with the Compensation Board.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that Sheriff Mitchell's request to replace Correctional Officer P. S. Cleaton, is hereby approved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Compensation Board.

IN RE: EXECUTIVE SESSION

Upon motion of Mr. Leftwich, seconded by Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Clay, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye", the Board moved into Executive Session at 9:40 P. M. The Board reconvened into open session at 10:05 P. M.

IN RE: ADJOURNMENT

Upon motion of Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Clay, Mr. Hodnett, Mr. Bennett, Mr. Leftwich, Mr. Hargrave, voting "aye", the meeting adjourned at 10:05 P. M.
