We kicked-off 2019 with the grand opening of our new Government Center. This beautiful facility has greatly improved the manner in which we are able to serve you and provides ample workspace for conducting County business. Renovation of the Pamplin Building wrapped-up in 2019 and the finished product is beautiful. This is the new home of administration offices for Dinwiddie County Public Schools and School Board as well as the General Registrar. If you have not had a chance to come and see these buildings for yourself, I encourage you to stop by for a self-guided tour. We are incredibly proud of the fact that the entire municipal project, which also included construction of a new public safety building, was completed without raising taxes.

2019 was also the year for broadband in Dinwiddie County. After winning a grant from the Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission, Dinwiddie enlisted the services of RiverStreet, LLC to make our dream a reality. Over the next three years, broadband coverage will be expanded to areas of the County that are currently unserved. This is BIG news for County residents and will greatly enhance quality of life for many of our citizens, as they will be able to access high-speed Internet from their homes.

In an effort to increase transparency and communication with the citizens we serve; the Board published the first-ever Countywide newsletter in 2019. The Dinwiddie Chronicle was delivered to more than 10,000 homes in the County. This is just one more way to share with you all of the great things that are happening in Dinwiddie County. We are working on the second edition now and it should hit mailboxes shortly after the first of the year.

Finally, in 2019 the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors reiterated its support of the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution, guaranteeing our right to bear arms. We heard the concerns of our citizens and, while we are sworn to uphold the Constitution, it was important to publicly state our position on this particular matter.

As this year comes to a close, so does my second term as Chairman of the Board. It has once again, been an honor to serve the citizens of Dinwiddie County as Board Chair. The faith and confidence that you have in us, as a Board, is evident in the fact that you elected us to
