Dear Citizens and Friends of Dinwiddie County,

The current Board of Supervisors is entering our third term together. Over the past eight years, we have made significant advancements in the areas of transparency, economic development and tourism. We have successfully opened a new community center in the Town of McKenney, completed the largest municipal building project in the history of Dinwiddie County, and started the process of bringing high-speed Internet to areas of the County that currently do not have access.

As the newly elected Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, my goal is to continue the momentum that brought us to this point. During the coming year, I would like to continue to expand our focus in two key areas.

First, I would like to address the issue of litter throughout Dinwiddie County. Dinwiddie covers 507 of Virginia's most beautiful square miles. As a farmer and lover of the outdoors, it makes me sad to see trash along the road as I drive through the County. The Board of Supervisors will work with County staff to develop strategies to reduce the litter in the County, which will result in a cleaner Dinwiddie.

Secondly, I would like to see Dinwiddie County take a more active role in both state and federal legislative processes. Our County is well represented in the Virginia Association of Counties (VACo) and National Association of Counties (NACo), and members of the Board hold leadership position within each organization. Dinwiddie County was among the first in the Commonwealth to adopt a resolution declaring the County a Second Amendment Sanctuary. Dinwiddie is emerging as a leader among localities and as such, we should work closely with elected officials to increase their awareness of how the issues they discuss and vote on in Richmond and Washington, DC directly affect our citizens.

Last, but certainly not least, I want to continue our mutually supportive and symbiotic relationship with the school system; so that we can nurture, encourage and help Dinwiddie students succeed.

It is an honor to serve a third term on this Board of Supervisors, and a privilege to serve as Chairman in 2020. I look forward to the coming year and continuing achievement of the County's vision "... offering an extraordinary community in which to spend a lifetime."
